As mentioned last year the Gender Equity Committee needs to keep an eye on the budget. When you are a football playing school there is no way the spending is going to be totally equal, but when the difference in per male spending and per female spending is more than \$100.00 you have a potential red flag issue. During the past school year the overall spending per male athlete was \$685.26 while the overall spending per female athlete was \$586.96 with a difference of \$98.30. You are very close to a red flag situation so it is recommended that the Gender Equity Committee continue to look at this	е
