3. Mr. Klaiber also reported that there are a less number of boys and girls involved with the total sports programs this year and some sports might be in jeopardy of not having enough students to fill the team rosters.
4. Mr. Mark Watkins has agreed to coach both the boys and girls basketball teams this year and will be able to give both teams the needed practice time and instruction.
5. Mr. Foster suggested that two students (a senior and a junior) be added to the Title IX committee. He suggested junior Alex Malloy and senior Katelyne Hardin. Committee agreed.

He has already started working on next year's schedules to insure proper equality of the different programs. There are some coaching positions that will be open and it is in the interest of the school to fill these as soon as possible. Mr. Klaiber will be accepting applications for these openings.
2. Mr. Klaiber also reported that the Booster Clubs were effective this year in providing for all the sports teams of the school. Their fundraisers and concessions money were put back into the program for the boys and the girls. 5. Dr. Foster will be seeking to assemble a new group of people to be members of this committee for next year.
6. No other new business was discussed.
