Some areas of concern in the Annual Report are . . . <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• In the Corrective Action Plan it implies that you will “try” to create a monthly report for Booster Clubs. If control of the Booster Clubs is a problem the Gender Equity Committee needs to immediately put a policy into place that will give the school control of the boosters.</li> <li>• With the figures given in the T-35-T-36 forms the overall spending per-male athletes compared to per-female athlete is getting very close to a potential RED</li> </ul>

E. cont'd	<p>Flag issues. Currently the school is spending \$553.00 per-male athlete compared to \$460.00 per-female athlete for a difference of \$93.00. At the present time that figure is in compliance. When you are a football playing school we know that the expenditures will never be equal but when the difference for these schools surpasses \$100.00 per athlete then a potential RED FLAG is in place. The Gender Equity Committee needs to keep an eye on this.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• After the overall spending we need to look at the spending in like sports and some potential problems to point out are . . . <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. A difference in Boys/Girls Basketball Travel of \$2,509.00.</li> <li>b. A difference in Baseball/Softball Travel of \$1,241.00.</li> <li>c. A ZERO figure in Boys/Girls Swimming when no one can travel free in today's world.</li> <li>d. A difference in Boys/Girls Basketball Publications of \$1,000.00.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p>There was also a big difference in Boys/Girls Golf but the Annual Report addressed this concern while the above situations were not addressed. The Gender Equity Committee needs to look at these situations and hopefully bring the spending closer together when the school basically has a 50/50 male/female population.</p>





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
