- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.

Plans to Address Interest: Swimming/Diving and tennis is not something we are not able to offer at this time. We do not have a facility for student athletes to practice. The nearest facility is more than 30 minutes away. It would require busing athletes to and from the facility. We do not have any agreements with these facilities, therefore additional costs would be incurred along with the transportation costs. The majority of the athletic contests would require at least a hour one way trip to participate. In the future if funds become available these areas of interest will be addressed.
