- Continue to determine if there is sufficient interest to have a girls freshman basketball team and JV softball team. Attempted to have both teams in 2007-2010 and there was not enough student interest. Committee is looking into ways to increase interest.
- Mail athletic interest letters to incoming female freshman students and have sports information table set up at freshman registration and orientation.
