However the report is conflicting in that the T-35-T-36 indicates the school does not offer Swimming, Tennis and Wrestling while the student interest survey shows strong interest in these areas. The T-35 and T-36 also indicate that there are coaches for Tennis and Wrestling in different levels of each sport. There is no indication in this report that the Gender Equity Committee has followed through with the latest survey to see if this interest is genuine in Swimming/Tennis/Wrestling, but they do acknowledge the interest in Lacrosse, Archery and Gymnastics. The Gender Equity Committee needs to look at these conflicting reports.

 - 40.3% Girl Athletes
 - 59.7% Boy Athletics
 - Test Two (Program Expansion):
 - Girls Teams Added 2 with 16 participants
 - Boys Teams Added 6 with 80 athletics (Varsity & JV football amongst them)
 - Test Three (Full Accommodations):
 - WVHS offers every sport with enough interest at this time based on Title IX surveys taken this school year.
- The Walton-Verona board of Education pays for an equal number of coaches for both men's and women's sports. If there is a discrepancy, it is because of volunteers within each individual programs.
- There was enough interest in boys' golf to warrant a JV team. This added extra costs for shirts. The boys also qualified for the All A state so we paid for the room and meal for that one night.
- The track at our sports complex was redone over the summer at a cost of almost \$80,000. This was a shared expense for both the boys and girls track teams.
- √WVHS paid for a new Cross Country course at our sports complex, cost of \$25,000. This was a shared expense between the boys and girls XC teams.
- We have had a varsity football team now for 2 years.
 - o I have no idea how any football school is compliant in any way.
 - o Equity in athletics is extremely important to WVHS, but with that being said it is virtually impossible to be equitable with the cost of starting a football program.
