In order to continue to meet this test in the future, the indicated interest in girls cross country (17) should be pursued for validity. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending is outside of acceptable parameters on both a percentage and per athlete basis. This spending should be closely monitored by school officials to insure that this disparity does not continue over a two-year period. This monitoring of athletic spending for parity should also be a part of the school's Corrective Action plan.

Girls Softball Facility Improvements: As noted during the Title IX audit conducted on site in October 2008, the girls softball field is located in an area which lacks easy access to concessions & restrooms. ** It should be noted that improvements made to this field were completed – these included the addition of additional bleachers which allowed closer access to concessions & restrooms, field renovations to improve drainage issues, and replacing a batting cage net.	Prior to the 2010 season, discussions were held at a Gender Equity Meeting to discuss concerns as noted in Column 1. With Park Director Bernard Smalley involved, it was determined that the girls softball team could play their games on the existing Little League Baseball field at Idle Hour park without conflicting with their teams.	Corrective action has been implemented; games are being played on the upper field. This results in access to concessions & restrooms which is equitable (in fact closer) than the boys baseball field. In addition, a new batting cage was installed on site as well. The corrective action that has been implemented has been well accepted by players, coaches, parents, & fans of the girls softball program.
Consideration of Archery program: Due to an interest in both male & female participants, the school is considering offering archery as a co-ed activity. Although not currently recognized by the KHSAA as a sanctioned sport, this will allow student to participate in an activity that is growing in popularity within the community.	A meeting was held between school personnel & parents to discuss the possibility of offering archery as a club at the high school level. The discussion pertained to equipment needs, transportation, coaches & volunteers, etc.	Consideration is being given to offering this in the 2010 / 2011 school year.
