Remember, test three – full accommodation means addressing the unmet interest of the underrepresented sex (most likely girls), not the overrepresented sex (most likely boys).

Plans to Address Interest: According to the 2009 – 2010 KHSAA TITLE IX Status Report, "The response on T-3 indicates that this area is being met, however, is not supported by the recent student interest survey which shows interest in cross country, golf, tennis, and swimming." The Gender Equity Committee addressed these areas during the 19 August 2010 meeting and sign-ups were conducted for golf and cross country. Six students signed up for golf and three students signed up for cross-country. However, golf sign ups were again conducted from 1 April to 13 April 2011, at present, nine students have signed up for 2011 golf (of which three are ineligible to participate) and one student signed up for cross-country. We will continue to conduct sign ups for golf and cross country and try to field teams in both sports for school year 2011 – 2012. Tennis and swimming are not viable at this time due to inadequate facilities and the cost to attempt to field two such teams.
