E.	x	☑Test 3 (Full and effective accommodation of interests and abilities) Other Recommendation and Comments: The data, calculations, and responses submitted indicate that the school is currently meeting the standard established in test #3 for provision of athletic opportunities. At this time all sanctioned sports are offered for girls at the varsity level. 14 total team opportunities are offered for girls as compared to 16 for boys. In the benefits area, total athletic spending is still slightly outside of acceptable parameters on both a percentage and per-athlete basis. The spending gap has been narrowed from that shown on last years report. It is essential at this point for the school to take the corrective action necessary to be within acceptable parameters by April 15, 2012.

 Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
