E.		 Other Recommendation and Comments: At the present time it appears that Berea High School is passing all 3 of the Title IX tests. The Gender Equity Committee needs to keep an eye on things to assure that the school is passing at least 1 test per-year. The Gender Equity Committee needs to resubmit the T-35 and T-36 form. The new form should include the levels of opportunity (Freshman, Junior Varsity, Varsity) offered in each sport as well as the number of coaches involved with each of the opportunities offered. The Gender Equity Committee needs to continue to look at the Award Policy as the T-35 and T-36 show figures that can be misleading to parents and outsiders.

The overall expenditures look much better In 2009-2010 the difference in spending per athlete was \$125.00 while in 2010-2011 the difference was \$63.95. Great job bringing this back from a potential RED FLAG issue.
