A possible red flag issue could be present when the school lists on the KHSAA web page that they are participating in Girls Cross Country and Track and Boys Track and then the Annual Report lists nothing for these sports on the T-35 and T-36. Both of these areas should reflect the same information. The Gender Equity Committee needs to continue to looks at the student interest surveys and to document the efforts they put forth to see if this interest is real and genuine. These efforts should be presented in the form of Corrective Action as was done this year with mentioning the possible addition of Boys Soccer.

- You have a potential area of concern dealing with travel. When a zero is listed
  for Baseball, Softball and Golf travel an outsider would see a potential Red Flag
  as we all know that no one travels free anymore. The method you are getting
  these athletes transported to away competition needs to be documented and put
  forth in Gender Equity Committee Minutes.
- In the area of Awards there is no explanation given for the difference in spending of awards for boys and girls basketball.
- In last years report it was pointed out that there was an issue with the monies spent on Boys and Girls Basketball publications. It appears that this potential Red Flag issue is still present. The Gender Equity Committee needs to continue to look at the possibility of combining boys and girls basketball into the same publications to eliminate this potential Red Flag area. A correction action needs to be put in place and documented in the Gender Equity Committee minutes.
- Minutes of the Gender Equity Committee are to be sent to the KHSAA with your annual report to document that Corrective Action Plans and other necessary action are being addressed by the Committee.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event.
