E.	x	Other Recommendation and Comments: The data, calculations, and responses submitted indicate that the standards established in both test #1 and test #3 for provision of athletic opportunities are currently being met. The information contained in the most recent student athletic interest survey appears to support the responses on the T-3 form. In the benefits area, total athletic spending is currently outside of acceptable parameters for provision of parity on both a percentage and per-athlete basis. This disparity appears to be explained and justified in the current corrective action plan.
