E.	x	Other Recommendation and Comments: The responses on the T-3 form indicate that the standard established in test #3 for provision of athletic opportunities is currently being met. The school sponsors all K.H.S.A.A. sanctioned sports for girls at the varsity level. A total of 14 team opportunities are offered for female participation as compared to 16 team opportunities for male participation. In the benefits area, total athletic spending appears to be outside of acceptable parameters for provision of parity on both a percentage and per-athlete basis. This spending should be closely monitored so that this disparity does not continue over a two year period.

- Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).
 Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard, if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.
