Enclosed please find the Title IX report for Graves County High School. As you will notice, we're making a conscious effort to improve the quality of our facilities and expand opportunities in all of our sports. Figures noted in this report reflect several improvements, especially in areas outside of football. In meeting a recommendation on the 2010-2011 Title IX status report, our expenditures per participating girl are \$733.49 compared to \$771.76 expenditures per participating boy.

As indicated in our last report, we have completed our volleyball dressing room which should bring greater opportunities to the volleyball program. Adding a third volleyball coach in 2009-2010 and freshman team has also added stability to the program. Adding middle school volleyball for the second year has also increased our numbers to the high school teams. This year for the first time we added elementary league volleyball which can only build a stronger program for the high school level.

We have also made several advances in our coaching staffs. Softball has added two additional coaches bringing their total number of coaches to five, equal to the number of baseball coaches. Golf has an additional assistant coach for girls to help increase the number in the girls golf program.

We also have added new poles and nets to our soccer fields, which will benefit both the girls and boys soccer programs. In the summer of 2011 we plan to expand our bleachers to the soccer fields and improve both the girls and boys soccer programs. Also in the summer of 2011 plans for adding a batting cage facility for the softball program will provide many opportunities for the softball program to advance.

We also added boys and girls bowling this year for the first time along with a bowling coach which is a certified staff member. We had over twenty participants. Our girls team qualified for the state meet and placed in the final eight teams.

Graves County High School and our athletic department are working hard to maintain equality to all of our students at Graves County High School. If you need any further information please contact me.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event.
