E.	x	Other Recommendation and Comments:The data and responses submitted indicate that the standard established in test #3 for provision of athletic opportunities is currently being met. The school sponsors all sanctioned sports for girls at the varsity level. A total of 13 team opportunities are offered for female participation as compared with 15 team opportunities for male participation. In the benefits area, total athletic spending appears to be within acceptable parameters for provision of parity. The report does imply that there is a disparity in the number of coaches provided for male versus female athletes. This issue should be addressed by the schools' G.E.R.C.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event.
