To Whom It May Concern:

Please note that between the 2009-2010 school year and the 2010-2011 school year, the enrollment of the June Buchanan School dropped significantly. Enrollment for 2009-2010 was 46 students while enrollment for 2010-2011 was and is 29 students. This is a difference of 37%. Due to this drop in enrollment numbers, the June Buchanan Athletic Department determined, with the aid of surveys and sign-up rosters, that it was not viable, or feasible, to participate in all of the sports that were participated in during the 2009-2010 school year. In 2009-2010, June Buchanan participated with 8 girls interscholastic teams and 4 boys interscholastic teams. In 2010-2011, these figures dropped to 5 girls interscholastic teams and 3 boys interscholastic teams.

Enrollment is expected to rise with the 2011-2012 school year. It has been determined that with this rise in enrollment the June Buchanan School will participate in girls volleyball, boys and girls bowling and, if viable, girls fast-pitch softball.
