Ε.	x	Other Recommendation and Comments:The data, calculations, and responses submitted indicate that the standard established in both test #1 and test #3 for provision of athletic opportunities are currently being met. As was documented on the T-65 form dated May 2, 2010, the responses on the T-3 form are not supported by the information contained in the most recent student athletic interest survey. The indicated interests in girls' soccer(47) and girls' track(24) must be explored for validity before the standard established in test #3 can be met. In the benefits area, total athletic spending continues to favor male athletes. Monitoring of spending in relation to provision of equitable benefits should continue.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male.
