E.		Other Recommendation and Comments: According to the figures given in this report it appears that Madison Southern is passing Test 1. On Test 3 there was only a 76.1% return on the Student Interest Survey. Since an 80% return is needed to be in compliance in this area the school can't be considered passing the test. The Gender Equity Committee needs to continue to stay on top of the students interest in Swimming and Wrestling. Make sure that you document in your committee minutes all the efforts taken to see if this interest is genuine. The Gender Equity Committee needs to continue to monitor the Awards Spending as there are still differences noted. There are concerns regarding the Track and Tennis

teams received no funds for awards, banquets, etc.

The area that is the biggest concern with the Athletic Program at Madison Southern is that of budget issues. Although it is noted that progress is being made in this area it is **HIGHLY RECOMMENDED** that the Gender Equity Committee continue to meet and look at this potential RED Flag situation . . .

- 2007-2008 there was \$277.00 more spent per male athlete
- 2008-2009 there was \$323.51 more spent per male athlete
- 2009-2010 there was \$115.50 more spent per male athlete

The Gender Equity Committee needs to get all the figures on renovation together and break down the boys and girls upgrades and this may well change some of these figures and help put a Corrective Plan together to bring the school back into compliance in the matter of overall spending.
