Dear Sir:

This letter is being sent to you as a requirement of the Title IX report for our school during the 2010-2011 school year. The letter states our position regarding student survey interest in establishing additional sports at Pendleton County High School.

The student interest survey taken in October, 2010 reflects interest in establishing the sports of bowling, archery and rifle. The Pendleton County School System is under a mandate because of budgetary issues; no new programs can be initiated outside of grant-funded programs, in either academic or athletic endeavors. We face the difficult task of eliminating a total of 11 certified and classified people at our high school staff alone.

The three sport interests listed previously would create a difficult financial situation for not only our school but also our school system. The cost of transportation alone in bowling would be devastating because our school would have to provide transportation on a daily basis for both practice and matches to one of the bowling alleys closest to our school. Falmouth does not have a bowling alley, the closest facilities are both approximately 25 -30 miles from school.

The establishment of any new sport is a luxury that we cannot afford at this time. We will continue to monitor student interest and as our financial distress reduces then hopefully we can begin the process of initiating new programs.
