Even though this is addressed in the Corrective Action Plan, a deficiency could occur if this continues over a 2-year period. Close monitoring and review should be done by Administration and the Gender Equity Committee. Additional follow-up documentation should be included with the 2012 Annual Report. Thank you.

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Plans to Address Interest:

Our enrollment has declined, as has our overall participation. Our interest in Volleyball declined significantly this year. Only 9.6% of students indicated they were interested this year. We now have our new gym open, so facilities are available. 15 of the 25 respondents were 8th and 9th graders, next year's FR. and Soph. classes. We are looking at possibility of trying to field a team at the JV level next year.
