Also, there are several sports showing no expenditure for awards. This should be reviewed and monitored by Administration and the Gender Equity Committee to insure equity for all sports. Thank you.

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male.
