D.	х	According to the 2010-2011 data, the school appears to be meeting the standards established in:  Test 1 (Athletic participation is proportionate to enrollment)  Test 2 (History and continuing practice of program expansion)  Test 3 (Full and effective accommodation of interests and abilities)
E.	х	Other Recommendation and Comments: The calculations submitted indicate that the standard established in test #1 for the provision of athletic opportunities is currently being met. The documentation (T-60 form) of the steps taken to address the indicated interest in girl's soccer and girl's cross country makes compliance with the standard established in test #3 also likely. In the benefits area, total athletic spending appears to be outside of acceptable parameters for provision of parity on both a percentage and per-athlete basis. This spending should be closely monitored so that this disparity does not continue over a two year period.

- Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).
   Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard, if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.
