- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first **date of regular season competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard, if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

FROM THE 2011-12 STUDENT SURVEY'S THERE WAS VIABLE INTEREST IN THREE AREAS: FISHING, ARCHERY AND SWIMMING/DIVING GIRLS. ARCHERY TOTALED 18 STUDENTS FROM THE SURVEYS, YET AFTER SEVERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS AND TIME SET TO GAIN ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ONLY 3 STUDENTS ATTENDED THE MEETING. FISHING TOTALED 11 STUDENTS FROM THE SURVEYS. AGAIN ANNOUNCEMENTS OF A GENERAL MEETING ABOUT THE SPORT WERE GENERATED DURING SCHOOL HOURS BUT ONLY 2 STUDENTS WERE IN ATTENDANCE AT THE ACTUAL MEETING. SWIMMING/DIVING GIRLS REVEALED 12 INTERESTS. THE CLOSEST FACILITY THAT WOULD ALLOW OUR STUDENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN THIS SPORT WOULD BE 28 MILES AWAY AND THAT FACILITY IS ALREADY BEING SHARED WITH TWO OTHER HIGH SCHOOL TEAMS PLUS THEIR LOCAL MEMBERSHIP (YMCA FACILITY).
