Along with this T65 form, you have also received a copy of a revised Title IX Internal Audit Summary for this school. It is important that you review all of the details concerning the analysis of the report submitted.

The Internal Audit Summary will analyze all parts of the three-part test for Title IX compliance, based on a snapshot of the data on the date submitted. Those conclusions are listed. For 2014-15, significant revisions have been made in this form, including many notes made to help you determine how calculations were derived and the exclusion of certain elements related to Archery and Bass Fishing which are true coed sport-activities.

In the first section you will note many factors such as per total participation, total expenditures, participant spending (per gender), and many other factors to be considered as you move forward with future planning. You will also note on Row 12, the determination of the underrepresented gender in your school. This is a critical element in determining Title IX compliance.

The Test 1 (traditionally called the "numbers" test) section is revised completely for 2014-15 as outside consultants have advised of multiple manners in which this test can be administered. In addition, there is guidance as to the number of new participants in the underrepresented gender needed to meet this test. Explanatory notes in the right column should help verify the calculations, which were done by the system based on the submitted data.

The Test 2 (traditionally called the "recent history of expanding sport offerings for the underrepresented gender" test) section contains the information for Test 2 and the calculations were done solely by the system based on the submitted data.

The Test 3 (traditionally called the "accommodating interest and abilities" test) section contains the information for Test 3. This is determined by the audit team based on the analysis of the data provided.

At the bottom of the Title IX Internal Audit Summary is a summary conclusion as to whether or not the school appears to be in compliance with one of the three parts of the tests for Title IX compliance. - 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first **date of regular season competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. We have had an archery team for the past several years. We did not have enough participation to offer it as a boys and girls team sport this year. We did offer archery as a club activity after school to help bring some interest to the sport. We have the equipment and facilities needed. We will continue to recruit Middle School and High School students to participate so we can offer this sport again at our school. We will hire a full time coach to coach archery. We want to bring this sport back.

We have been monitoring the past two years to see if there would be sufficient participation to form a volleyball team. We held two meetings during school this year to see how many girls were interested in participating. At the first meeting we had 6 girls show up. At the second meeting we had 3 girls show up. We have good participation in girls soccer. Our numbers are up. We have a few that participate in cross country. Our participation in cheerleading is up too. We will continue to monitor to ensure if there is a need, we will offer it as a team sport. In our gym classes we teach a unit on volleyball so our girls are exposed to it. We also would first offer this as an after school activity and build interest in participation.

We also need more female golfers to participate on our girls golf team. We are offering free lessons at the local course for any students who would like to learn. Our golf coach continues to recruit females and males. We are a small school and it is hard to have enough for a team. We do have some Middle School female students that are interested. Our coach is helping in teaching them how to play.

We also did not have enough students to have a swim team this year. In the past we had several males and several females that participated but this year no student wanted to participate. We have a swim coach in place if there are enough students to participate as an individual or as a team next year. We are also recruiting at the local YMCA to see what students swim and can not. The YMCA does offer

swim lessons and we are encouraging students to go and learn how to swim.

Also, our numbers in bowling were down this year. The past several years we have had adequate participation but this year only a few students wanted to bowl. We are encouraging more students to participate. We do not have a bowling lane in our town. Students have to travel to Lexington to PainticipateSigMaturexidents wanted by a participate of the bowling team? Again, we need to recruit and teach more Middle Schools how to bowl so they will participate when they get in High School.

We want to grow and continue to offer these individual sports for our students. We are working hard to ensure that we provide the necessary equipment, training and coaching to give the students are sectorable to participate in they want to.
