Along with this T65 form, you have also received a copy of a revised Title IX Internal Audit Summary for this school. It is important that you review all of the details concerning the analysis of the report submitted.

The Internal Audit Summary will analyze all parts of the three-part test for Title IX compliance, based on a snapshot of the data on the date submitted. Those conclusions are listed. For 2015-16, revisions have been made in this form to clarify the calculation of the underrepresented gender and ensure the preservation of the integrity of the foundational purposes of Title IX. The form also continues to contain notes made to help you determine how calculations were derived and detail the exclusion of certain elements related to Archery and Bass Fishing which are true coed sport-activities.

In the first section you will note many factors such as per total participation, total expenditures, participant spending (per gender), and many other factors to be considered as you move forward with future planning. You will also note on Row 13, the determination of the underrepresented gender in your school. This is a critical element in determining Title IX compliance.

The Test 1 (traditionally called the “numbers” test) section again contains guidance as to the number of new participants in the underrepresented gender needed to meet this test. Explanatory notes in the right column should help verify the calculations, which were done by the system based on the submitted data.

The Test 2 (traditionally called the “recent history of expanding sport offerings for the underrepresented gender” test) section contains the information for Test 2 and the calculations were done solely by the system based on the submitted data.

The Test 3 (traditionally called the “accommodating interest and abilities” test) section contains the information for Test 3. This is determined by the audit team based on the analysis of the data provided.

At the bottom of the Title IX Internal Audit Summary is a summary conclusion as to whether or not the school appears to be in compliance with one of the three parts of the tests for Title IX compliance. We want to offer and bring it back next year if possible for boys and girls in the high School and Middle Schools. We will fund the program and we are recruiting more students to participate. Getting our kids to Lexington and transportation has been a problem that we will solve. We do not have a bowling alley in Paris.</p> <p>2. There was a need for gymnastics for girls and a few males at PHS. We have a gymnastics boys and girls program that is done in conjunction with the cheerleaders. Our cheer coach is teaching gymnastics to girls and a few boys. We have over 20 girls in the program and they want to compete outside of school next year. We ordered \$6,000.00 worth of gym mats and we are recruiting in the Middle School along with the High School. This program is being done on an intramural basis and is growing fast with our younger kids.</p> <p>3. We still are showing some interest in girls volleyball but not enough to get the program going. We held 3 separate meetings in the fall to check our interest and only 4 girls showed up for the first meeting and 3 for the second meeting and 5 for the third meeting. We will continue to monitor this situation.</p> <p>4. Archery is a sport we are continuing to recruit and get more students involved with. We have a boys/girls archery coach and they practice 3 times a week away from school. We had an equal participation of boys and girls this year. We will encourage more support and funding next year to promote our Archery program. I see it growing more and more next year.</p> <p>5. Cross Country is still offered as we just had a few participants this year. Our elementary school held several running events and we had great participation from the elementary kids. I see us having over 20</p>
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kids participating in this sport in the next couple of years. We have designed our own course and we have good parent support in the elementary and Middle School programs. We will continue to build on this program. It is very popular with our elementary kids. Our coach works with High School, Middle School and the Elementary.

Principal Sign Middle School baseball program and our Middle School kids participate on that level. We did not have any 8th graders play on the High School team so our baseball numbers were low and not enough for a JV team. Our softball team has good numbers with Varsity, JV and freshman teams. They let their Middle School kids play on the High School team.

7. Several years ago we had a swimming team, boys/girls. We hold a meeting each fall to see if any of our students want to swim and compete. We have a swimming coach on our staff in case there are enough students that want to swim. We will continue to recruit for this. Our pool is located at the local YMCA.
