Comments: According to the data and calculations submitted by the school, it has met the standard established in Test 1 for the provision of athletic opportunities during two of the past three school years (2006-07 and 2007-08) but is not currently meeting that standard.

Comments: According to data and calculations submitted by the school, it has not met the standard established in Test 2 for the provision of athletic opportunities during any of the past three school years.

Comments: According to the information and responses submitted by the school, it has met the standard established in Test 3 for the provision of athletic opportunities during each of the past three school years.

Comments: According to data submitted by the school in the 2007-08 annual report, a 91% return rate was received on the most recent student athletic interest survey.

Equipment and Supplies	X	The recent visit revealed that the school has a uniform review and/or replacement plan based on a four-year rotation. The school provides a high quality uniform for all student athletes. The school currently has a contract with the Adidas Corporation for provision of uniforms. Both the quantity and quality of athletic equipment and supplies appeared to be comparable for boys and girls. According to the school's re-visit report and its 2008-09 annual report, it was spending approximately \$309 per female athlete and \$559 per male athlete for the provision of equipment and supplies. School officials were cautioned to monitor spending in this area for provision of equitable benefits.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X	The February 14, 2000 audit report stated that this area could not be fully evaluated due to the failure of the school to submit proper documentation. The recent visit showed that all shared practice facilities were assigned equitably. According to the school's re-visit report, the scheduling of competitive events for "like" sports appears to have shown parity over a two-year period. According to the school's 2008-09 girls basketball schedule posted on the KHSAA web site, 40% (4/10) of their home games were played on prime dates, and a review of game times indicates that the requested standard for prime time play is also being met.
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X	None of the past annual reports include expenditures for travel and per diem. The current re-visit form does include these expenditures. School officials assured KHSAA representatives that this data will be included on future annual reports. Data submitted on the re-visit reports indicates that the school is spending approximately \$179 per female athlete and approximately \$186 per male athlete for the provision of travel and per diem. The school's Title IX file contained written guidelines for provision of equitable travel and per diem allowance.

Coaching		According to the school's re-visit report, the total spending per team for coaches' salaries appeared to show equivalence. A review of the school district's extra service pay schedule for coaches showed parity. According to the school's 2008-09 annual report, the number of coaches provided for "like" sports was comparable. The school's re-visit report indicated that 44% (4/9) of the girls head coaches were on-campus employees compared to 50% (5/10) of the boys head coaches.
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X	Both the competitive and practice facilities, as well as the locker room facilities, are rated very good to excellent. Currently, the female athletes seem to have the advantage in this area due to the construction of a new state of the art softball field on the school campus. The amenities provided at the softball field are superior to those provided at any other outdoor facility at the school. The girls and boys basketball teams have exclusive locker rooms. The girls locker room is currently undergoing renovation with a projected completion date of December 15, 2009. According to plan, the renovated girls basketball dressing room will have amenities which mirror those of the boys basketball locker room. The boys and girls soccer teams share a well appointed dressing room located adjacent to their field. All other teams share the two PE dressing rooms. The assignment of these dressing rooms appears equitable. All teams appear to be provided adequate equipment storage space.

Medical and Training Facilities and Services			The school currently as two weight training rooms. Weight Room 1 is open to all sports teams except football and wrestling. It has a written usage schedule posted at the facility which seems to be equitable. This room has equipment appropriate for use by female athletes. Weight Room 2 is used by the football and wrestling teams as well as physical education classes for conditioning. The school has a large well-equipped athletic training room. A certified trainer employed by the school district with 23 years of experience is accessible to all student athletes each day on an equitable basis. Student athletic physical examinations are offered free of charge at either Kings Daughters or Our Lady of Bellefonte Hospitals.
Publicity	X		According to the school's re-visit form, it sponsors one cheerleading squad which cheers at all home games and "local" away games for football and boys and girls basketball. The athletic director and principal are responsible for monitoring the number of "local" games for parity. The school's pep band performs at all home boys and girls basketball games as well as all home football games. The school's dance team performs at "specific" home boys and girls basketball games. School administrators should monitor the number of "specific" games for equity. According to the school's re-visit form, total spending for publicity and recognition appears comparable for "like" sports.

Support Services	X	According to administrators, the school currently has one athletic booster club. The purchase order process is required for all athletic expenditures no matter what the source of the funds. The school has a written agreement with the booster club. Evaluation of athletic expenditures over the past two years shows that spending was well within acceptable parameters for parity during the 2007-08 school year on both a percentage and per athlete basis. Evaluation of expenditures for the 2008-09 school year indicates that the school was outside acceptable parameters for parity on both a percentage and per athlete basis. SCHOOL OFFICIALS WERE CAUTIONED TO MONITOR ALL EXPENDITURES FOR PROVISION OF EQUIVALENCE SO THAT NO DISPARITY CONTINUES OVER A TWO-YEAR BASIS.
