(Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball) On or before July 30, 2001, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2000/2001 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during prime times (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for prime times), the school shall advise the

KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference.

(Selection of Cheerleaders) On or before July 30, 2001, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys' and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sport (i.e., boys' varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).

(Athletic Documentation) On or before April 15, 2002, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the development of written policies and procedures as mentioned in Item 10 that should help ensure continued compliance.

10. Comments

a) Title IX Report

 The school personnel had a few problems with the calculations on the reports for both years. These have been clarified and corrected since the original report was submitted.

b) General Athletic Policies

While the following areas do not represent specific past documented problems, it is worthy to note that they should be addressed in written athletic policies to ensure that future decision makers are as concerned with equity as the current staff.

- I. School personnel benefit greatly from its requirement for a single booster organization. This should be documented in writing and placed in the permanent Title IX File.
- II. Practice plans and facility rotation plans should be formalized, particularly with the new outdoor facilities, to enable all coaches to make informed decisions. Existing plans for winter sports (i.e. posted calendars) could be used as a model for these discussions.
- III. A planned equipment replacement policy for both game and practice equipment should be adopted so that boys equipment is not always replaced first. This will ensure that all teams remain at a consistent level of quality for apparel for practice and competition.
- IV. A policy should be developed to determine which banners and trophies will be displayed in prominent areas so that all boys' and girls' teams, will have equal treatment and a pre-determined opportunity for exposure.

c) General

This is a school that has benefited greatly from outstanding leadership and direction as it has grown from its development into the outstanding school to its current status today. Administrators (both athletic and academic), coaches, parents, boosters and athletes can be proud of a program that attempts to treat all of its students equally, and which is committed to maintaining that balance in the future.
