Accommodation of Interests and Abilities	X	According to the school's most recent submittal to the KHSAA, the standards established in Test #2 have been met. The proper consistency and follow-up in the development of a Corrective Action Plan was explained to school officials. The need for at least one equity meeting in the fall, one in winter, and one in the spring was emphasized to school officials. The fact that self-audit reports for wrestling and swimming were not in the 1999-2000 Title IX report made a complete audit difficult. It was stressed to school officials that these reports should be completed and placed in the school file.
Equipment and Supplies	X	The school visit showed that Campbellsville High School attempts to provide good quality and safe equipment for all athletes at the school. The school has a uniform rotation plan in place. School officials were alerted to the fact that the Equipment and Supply Summary Form (T-8) in their self-audit document is not filled out correctly. This document is to be corrected and returned to the school's file.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X	"Prime time" scheduling was discussed. The school played 59% of their girls' basketball games in "prime time" in 2001-2002. They have 33% of their games scheduled in "prime time" in 2002-2003. They are working toward a consistent 50% each year in regard to this category.
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X	The summary form in this area (T-16) is filled out incorrectly. School officials were alerted to this fact and informed that it should be corrected. The need for the development of a school policy on meal allotments was discussed with the Gender Equity Committee.

5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (T-60)

The school's most recent corrective action plan calls for dressing facilities and restrooms for softball and soccer, the passage of a salary stipend for girls' weight lifting, the addition of grass and lights to the soccer field, an increase in "prime time" games for girls' basketball, for the athletic director to be in charge of all scheduling, the hiring of a girls' golf coach, the expansion of the girls' basketball office, and to study the possibility of adding cross country as a sport.

6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

The major observed deficiency reflected by the school visit was the disparity in competitive facilities primarily due to neglecting the needs at the softball facility in comparison to the other outdoor boys' sports. (See KHSAA Recommended Action.)

As stated previously, the major facility recommendations relate to improvements related to the girls' softball facility. (See KHSAA Recommended Action.)

(Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities) On or before <u>April 1, 2003</u>,

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the school is requested to submit to KHSAA a detailed description of planned improvements to the girls' softball facility. This plan is to include but not be limited to the following improvements in benefits: (1) provision of covered dugouts, (2) provision of school district transportation to the practice and game facility, (3) Provision of equitable designated dressing facilities, (4) provision of restroom facilities comparable to other outdoor sports at the school, (5) provision of access to an indoor hitting facility which is comparable to the one already on campus at the school. This written plan, as required by KHSAA, is to have specific dates for completion of the designated improvements above and is also to be included in the April 15, 2003 submittal to KHSAA as part of the school's Corrective Action Plan.
