6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

The major difficulties discussed with the Gender Equity Review Committee on October 30, 2001, was the failure to meet the tests for opportunities and the need to develop an accurate Title IX file.

7. Facility Recommendations or Concerns

The major inequity in relation to facilities is the lack of air conditioning in the girls' basketball locker room.

School shall submit the following additional information:

(Accommodation of Student Interest and Abilities) On or before December 15, 2001, the school is requested to submit to the KHSAA a letter detailing the steps taken toward the establishment of a volleyball program as listed in the June 6, 2001 Corrective Action Plan.

(Support Services—Budget) On or before December 15, 2001, the school is requested to submit Forms T-35 and T-36 for the 1999-2000 school year showing all expenditures for all sports offered.

(Locker Rooms, Practice, and Competitive Facilities) On or before April 15, 2002, the school is requested to submit to the KHSAA written verification that air conditioning has been installed in the girls' dressing room in the gym.

(Selection of Cheerleaders) On or before April 15, 2002, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sport (i.e., boys' varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).

(Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball) On or before April 15, 2002, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2001/2002 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during prime times (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for prime times), the school shall advise the KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference.
