5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (T-60)

The Corrective Action Plans for 2000, 2001, and 2002 all called for obtaining trainers for home games. The Gender Equity Review Committee was made aware that documentation of the attempts to gain coverage by a trainer should be included in the 2003-2004 Corrective Action Plan. The 2002-2003 Corrective Action Plan called for the increase in enrollment of girls. While this is a real concern for the school, this is not an equity issue. Improvement in storage areas was discussed as a possibility for future action plans.

6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs At this time there are no major deficiencies in the athletic program.

7. Facility Recommendations or Concerns
Storage areas for all teams should be improved. Continued long range planning for possible on campus facilities is important. On campus facilities add to school pride and loyalty.
