Comment:

T-1 is incomplete. The school has failed to provide necessary information regarding the number of students participating in interscholastic athletics. The school should be reminded that cheerleaders should not be included in calculations for opportunities compliance and that students participating on more than one team may be double or triple counted.

Comment:

T-2 is incomplete. Again, the school has failed to provide most of the information sought. Likewise, T-4 is incomplete.

C.) If Full and Effective Accommodation of Interest and Abilities is chosen, does it appear that the school provides opportunities in areas of students' interest?

Comment:

The school has recently added a girls' soccer team which appears to be responsive to student interest surveys. However, it does not appear that the school included 11th grade students in this survey. Therefore, because surveys are incomplete, the school has not demonstrated compliance under any prong of the three-prong test regarding equivalent opportunities.

School shall submit the following additional information:

(Selection of Cheerleaders) On or before February 2, 2001, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys' and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result

in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sport (i.e., boys' varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).

(Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball) On or before February 2, 2001, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2000/2001 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during prime times (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for prime times), the school shall advise the KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference.

(Supplemental information) As previously indicated, the school has failed to accurately summarize information requested by forms T-1, T-2 and T-4. The school is directed to provide this information (corrected, completed forms) relating to the 1999/2000 school year on or before February 2, 2001. In completing these forms, the school is directed that cheerleaders are not to be included in the calculations. Further, students who participate on more than one team shall be counted for each team on which they participate. Also, if a student participates at more than one level of interscholastic competition (for example, varsity and junior varsity) he or she shall be counted at each level of competition.

(Student Surveys) With respect to all future student surveys, the school is instructed that it shall include at least 9th, 10th and 11th grade students.

(Tutorial Policy) On or before February 2, 2001, the school shall advise the KHSAA of its policy for providing tutorial services to student-athletes as well as other students enrolled at the school.

(Awards Policy) On or before February 2, 2001, the school shall advise the KHSAA of its policy for awards given to student-athletes. This shall include, but shall not be limited to, awards given through booster groups and other such entities.
