Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		No dissatisfaction expressed. The school should schedule girls' basketball in prime time on an equal basis with boys. There was a report for Jr. High basketball, but none for girls' basketball on the Jr. High level.
Travel and Per Diem Allowances			The summary figures do not represent individual team reports for trips. There was no response on a dollar amount for meals. Some questions were not answered by coaches.
Coaching	x		Volleyball is a new sport for 2000. Softball is a new sport for the spring (2001) if enough girls field a team.
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities		X	The number of lockers available were not listed on any report except one. A lack of adequate lockers was apparent to the evaluator on the visit. The playing field used for baseball and softball lacks a press box, electronic scoreboard and restrooms.
Medical and Training Facilities and Services		X	The absence of a certified trainer for sports that are higher risk is an area of concern. Immediate attention should be given to this area. The summary and team report for this component conflict.
Publicity			Form T-33 was never summarized to reflect a comparison for girls and boys. Request Form T-33 to be completed and returned to KHSAA by December 15, 2000.
Support Services	X		Office space seems to be a problem for al sports regardless of gender. This is an area to be considered in new facility that will accommodate coaches to perform their duties.

KHSAA To Follow-Up Regarding Corrective Action If Necessary On The 9. Following:

(Selection of Cheerleaders) On or before December 15, 2000, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys' and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sport (i.e., boys' varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).

(Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball) On or before December 15, 2000, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2000/2001 season. The school should also provide similar information for the 1999/2000 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during prime times (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for prime times), the school shall advise the KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference.

The evaluator is aware that Fern Creek is one of the schools to be consolidated and the report includes an evaluation of the existing facility, equipment and supplies, etc. While three schools are under one roof, three different staffs can bring individual philosophies, and should consolidate their thoughts and ideas for a building that can accommodate girls and boys on an equal basis. Lockers, storage, office space, equipment, supplies, training and weights facilities should be evaluated by the school on a regular basis.

(Other) Forms T-35 and T-36 need to be completed and re-submitted to the KHSAA on or before **December 15, 2000** as well as form T-33 which must be summarized completely.

In April of each school year posters and public announcements are made requesting student participation for Girls' Varsity and Boys' Varsity Cheerleading squads. This announcement is made each day for one week and posters are hung where all students can view them. During that week and at the end of the week the students are directed to register with the sponsor for the cheerleading squad that they want to participate for the next school year. The choice of the squad is left entirely up to the students.

After the students register with their choice of cheerleading squad the students have three weeks to practice for try-outs. Try-outs for both squads are conducted at the same time. Collaborating together both sponsors choose official KAPOS judges. The judges rate the participants. After judging is completed, the sponsors are given the scores of the ones who registered for their squads.

Due to the small size of our school we do not cut any participate who competed for either cheerleading squad. The purpose of the scores is to designate captains and co-captains.
