#### 5. Brief Summary/Analysis of The Corrective Action Plan (T-60)

Corrective action plan indicates an inappropriate time frame of "within 5 years" for lights to be added to the softball facility. School indicates it may be 5-10 years before a field house of any kind might be added to the girls' softball facility/field which is a '¼ mile from the baseball/football fields and accompanying fieldhouse. A definite plan should be produced to share the current field house facility until softball facility is built.

- 9. KHSAA To Follow-Up Regarding Corrective Action If Necessary On The Following:

(Selection of Cheerleaders) On or before December 15, 2000, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys' and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sport (i.e., boys' varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).

(Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball) On or before December 15, 2000, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2000/2001 season. The school should also provide similar information for the 1999/2000 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during prime times (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for prime times), the school shall advise the KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference.

#### 1. (Equipment and Supplies)

- Inadequate storage facilities appear to be provided for the girls' golf and volleyball teams.
- Inadequate student managers are available for girls' teams as compared to boys' teams.
- Apparently there are no game uniforms provided for the girls' basketball team.
- Summary forms do not reflect the information contained in the team reports.

#### 2. (Scheduling of Games and Practice Time)

• School should provide to KHSAA no later than **December 15, 2000** written evidence that it has attempted to equitably schedule boys' and girls' basketball games for the 2000/2001 year or before.

School provide evidence by **December 15, 2000** as to decision to allow only 12 girls' golf matches compared to boys' 16 golf matches.

School should provide time- table to install lights on softball field in a more timely fashion than 5 years out.

School should provide evidence by **December 15, 2000** as to why boys' tennis has 20 matches and girls' only 14 matches.

- Boys' and girls' track team should be split.
- School shall provide to KHSAA no later than **December 15, 2000**, a schedule of practice times for volleyball that allows adequate practice times for an inseason sport.

#### 3. (Coaches)

• While basically equitable there does exist a need for the school to address salary variances in boys'/girls' basketball assistant coaches, boys'/girls' soccer and boys' baseball and girls' softball.

#### 4. (Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities)

• No team reports; Please submit locker room information.

#### 5. (Medical Training Facilities)

• The school should take steps to ensure that all teams are provided comparable trainers and medical personnel as is maintained for boys' teams in basketball and football no later than **December 15, 2000**. Weight room schedule should be established no later than **December 15, 2000** to ensure equal use by girls' teams.

#### 6. (Publicity)

Football receives the only publicity to amount to anything.



Dear Ms. Collett:



On Tuesday November 23, 1999, Louis Stout, Brigid DeVries, Larry Boucher & Danny Reeves meet with representatives of Franklin County High School in Frankfort, Kentucky. This meeting was scheduled prior to the visit and held for the purpose of discussing/reviewing Title IX requirements related to athletic programs at the school. Those present on behalf of Franklin County included:

It was noted that Assistant Superintendent, Gary Lawson, is the Title IX coordinator for the district.

Ms. DeVries and Danny Reeves discussed with the Franklin County representatives the manner in which these forms were to be used. Franklin County was advise that the appropriate school representatives should complete the Verification Form, together with the forms contained within the Audit Manual, and returned to the KHSAA on or before the 6/30/00 deadline. In addition, the extent Franklin County needs to implement a Corrective Action Plan for coming into compliance in any areas that plan should be submitted with the Verification Form and other forms on or before 6/30/00. The Franklin County Representatives indicated they understood these requirements.

After discussing the forms to be submitted to the KHSAA, we conducted a brief review of the applicable law and Title IX requirements. Following this discussion, Ms. DeVries and Danny Reeves reviewed the following specific areas with the school's representatives:

- 1. Accommodation of interests and abilities (including the three pronged test for compliance regarding athletic opportunities);
- 2. Equipment and supplies;
- 3. Scheduling of game times and practice times;
- 4. Travel and per diem allowances;
- 5. Coaching;
- 6. Locker rooms, practice times and facilities issues;
- Medical and training facilities and related services;

9. Support Services

In addition, a brief discussion was held of the following Title IX areas;

1. Athletic scholarships

2. Tutoring;

3. Housing and Dining Facilitities and Services; and

4. Recruiting.

Ms. DeVries and Texplained that it was unlikely that any of these last four areas would be applicable at Franklin County. Therefore, the school's focus should be on the first nine areas listed above.

The school representatives ask a number of questions during this portion of the review. Those present discussed in some detail the fact that the school has previously instituted a schedule for practice times for Boys and Girls Basketball. (A copy of this schedule was included in a preliminary plan submitted by the Gender Equity Review Committee.) In addition, those present discussed several alternatives to the present game schedules for winter sports, i.e. girls' and boys' basketball) which would allow both programs to take advantage of what is generally considered prime playing time (e.g. Friday night).

The school representatives then discussed several steps they have already undertaken in order to comply with Title IX. These include:

- 1. Assessing proportionality of male and female students with those participating in sports. (Initially cheerleaders were used in calculations and will have to be removed in the final report).
- 2. Establish a brief history of sports added within the last 5 years.
- 3. Preliminary scheduling of the pre-season conditioning schedules of baseball and softball in the "Athletic Field house", it was noted that softball had first choice of the time schedule.

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4. Establishing a 5-year uniform purchase plan for all sports.

Following this discussion, Mr. Don Sturgeon gave us a tour of the athletic facilities. Mr. Sturgeon indicated that the school intended to do some improvements to the softball field to upgrade it similar to the baseball facility. It was also mentioned that the "Athletic Field House" be made more accessible to all student athletes at Franklin County.

A public comment session was held at Franklin County High School Library beginning at 6:30 p.m. A few parents and a writer for the State Journal Newspaper appeared at the session. Mr. Stout, Ms. DeVries and Danny Reeves provided an overview of our involvement in Title IX monitoring. Some of the questions asked included some initial concerns on the amount of time it took to begin the girls soccer program. One person wanted a clarification on why cheerleading and other extracurricular activities were not included in determining the number of sports offerings. Ms. DeVries clarified the OCR position on sports offerings, which currently does not include band, drill teams, dance teams cheerleading or intramurals. Booster club involvement and fund issues were clarified also. We explained that coaches would be instrumental in ensuring that school officials obtained full cooperation from parents and booster clubs. The open forum concluded at approximately 7:30 p.m.
