It appears that school personnel performed the calculation correctly and the result suggest that Substantial Proportionality is an area of compliance. For the 1999 – 2000 Report, 35 females were enrolled; representing 37% of the total enrollment (94 students). Sixteen of the 47 interscholastic participants were female; (34% of all athletes). The percent of total female participation (34%) compared with the percentage of total female enrollment (37%) is within three percentage points.

It is noted that Cloverport is a small community and the enrollment at Frederick Fraize is approximately 95 students. Facilities in both the community and school are limited. Athletic offerings include varsity basketball and varsity tennis for both males and females and junior varsity basketball for males.
Equipment and Supplies	X		The quality and quantity of uniforms are comparable for both male and female participants. A written policy is followed for the purchase of new uniforms which include a five-year rotation for replacement.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		The scheduling of practice for the basketball teams is equitable; a rotation of early/late gymnasium use at the sports center is in place. Both double headers and prime time games are included in the girls' basketball schedule.
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X		Bus transportation is provided, and students purchase their own food for away contests.
Coaching	X		Supplements for the coaching positions are equitable.
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X		Overall, the locker rooms and the competitive facilities for athletics are adequate. Two locker rooms are located at the sports center, one for the basketball teams and the other one for visiting teams. The "team" locker room is converted into a weight room during the off-season and both male and female athletes have access to weight training. All basketball practices and games are
			held in the gymnasium at the sports center. A written policy for the display of banners is being developed. Boys' and girls' tennis practice takes place at the Cloverport City Park courts and matches are held at Rough River State Park.
