Future surveys should include this information.	
Equipment and Supplies	X		The school needs to provide storage space for softball. The addition of uniforms for all sports not having uniforms should also be included.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		Practice less for softball before the season begins. A review of the schedule of girls' basketball games in 2002 needs to reflect more prime time games.
Travel and Per Diem Allowances		X	The school spent \$4,300 in per diem for boys' sports and \$891 for girls. This could be a red flag in this area.

Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities		X	Softball does not have locker room space provided for the players due to the distance from the field. The number of locker spaces provided for girls' sports is noticeably lower than for the boys.

5.	Brief Summar	y/Analysis	of The	Corrective	Action	Plan	(T-60)
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The school plans to re-educate boosters and coaches about Title IX. This in itself should improve the overall athletic programs.

The school plans to address the girls basketball game schedule by (2002).

The school plans to provide additional storage space for all sports.

The interest shown in volleyball has prompted the school to investigate regional interest for possible addition to the program.

6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

Either medical personnel or a certified trainer needs to be available to all participating athletes. This seems to be a deficiency in both programs. The boys basketball team is the only sport provided medical service.

A training room/weight room needs a schedule to be put in place and posted.

7. Facility Recommendations or Concerns

Additional locker space needs to be provided for girls' sports.

Appropriate weights for girls should be purchased. Lighter weights suitable for girls did not appear to be on site.

	to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys' and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sport (i.e., boys')
	varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).
	(Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball) On or before December 15, 2000, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2000/2001 season. The school should also provide similar information for the 1999/2000 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during prime times (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for prime times), the school shall advise the KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference.
