Comments: At the time of this audit Hopkinsville High School is offering every sport that the KHSAA has to offer. During the past five years only one level of competitive offerings has been added so it appears that Hopkinsville is not in compliance with Test 2.

Comments: With all the sports offerings for boys and girls at Hopkinsville it appears that the school is in compliance with the requirements for passing Test 3. It is pointed out that the last two student interest surveys have had a low return rate so the Gender Equity Review Committee should look at ways to get a better return rate when the survey is given again in 2011-2012.

#### 5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (Form T-60)

At the present time the biggest task before the Gender Equity Review Committee is the re-evaluation of several policies. The new Athletic Director is in his first year and has some very good ideas that he should document in a corrective action plan. A copy of any and all corrective action agreed upon by the Gender Equity Review Committee should be sent to the KHSAA by May 16, 2011.

#### 6. KHSAA Recommended Action in relation to new deficiencies

At the time of the original audit there were some concerns with some of the policies the school had never put in place. These policies are now in the permanent Title IX file, but many are very vague and would be hard for outsiders to understand if the Title IX file or Athletic Handbook were observed. There are no overall deficiencies at this time but the Gender Equity Review Committee is being asked to reevaluate several policies.

#### 7. KHSAA Recommended Action in relation to reoccurring deficiencies

A potential red flag area is dealing with the control of Booster Clubs in regards to spending. The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to strongly consider implementing signed Booster Club agreements.
