5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (T-60)

The weight room in its present condition does not seem to be conducive for male or female use. The room is large and, with the addition of some improvements in maintenance and the addition of updated weights, the room could be very productive.

7. Facility Recommendations or Concerns

The outdoor facilities are not properties of the school district, but are owned and operated by the Jenkins Field Commission. This limits the school in its operation and management of these facilities.

(Selection of Cheerleaders) On or before April 15, 2004, school personnel are requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys' and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sport (i.e., boys' varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).

(Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball) On or before January 15, 2004, school personnel are requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" home games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2004-2005 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during "prime times" (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for "prime times"), the school shall advise the KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference to ensure a minimum of 40%.

(Support Services) School personnel shall resubmit Forms T-35 & T-36 (Budget and Actual Expenditures) for 2002-2003 reflecting all booster monies by **December 15, 2003**.

(Corrective Action) School personnel shall resubmit Form T-60 (Corrective Action Plan) for 2002-2003 listing noted items for correction by **December 15, 2003**.
