The documentation supplied by school personnel indicated Lawrence County High School met the standard established in this test during the 2001-2002 and 2002-2003 school years, but not in the 2003-2004 school year. The school re-visit raised some questions as to the degree to which the school has pursued the athletic interests expressed on the student survey. There is no current evidence to suggest the interests have been addressed.

Accommodation of Interests and Abilities	X		<p>According to data and calculations provided to the KHSAA, the school met the standard in Test #3 in 2001-2002; met the standards in Tests #1 and 3 in 2002-2003; and Tests #1 and 2 in 2003-2004. Although the standards of these tests appear to be met and no deficiency is assigned in this area, <u>there continues to be problems with proper documentation by school officials</u>. During the March 10, 2003 KHSAA visit, officials found <u>no</u> minutes from Gender Equity Review Committee meetings. The audit report from that visit requested that required Gender Equity Committee meeting minutes be kept. The re-visit showed minutes from only <u>one</u> recent meeting since <u>March 10, 2003</u>. The audit report of March 10, 2003 also requested that <u>numerous</u> forms be corrected in the school file. Although there is some indication that these files have been corrected, they have <u>not</u> been placed correctly in the school file. Documentation also indicates that the school re-visit summary <u>was not</u> shared with the Equity Committee as requested. Much of the time during the original visit was used to explain proper administrative procedures. The re-visit revealed that, for the most part, these procedures have not been followed (See KHSAA Recommended Action).</p>

<p>Equipment and Supplies</p>		<p>X</p>	<p>Although the school visit again indicated that adequate uniforms and equipment are provided, school documentation and accounting does not support equity in this area. Expenditures listed by the school for equipment and supplies on the April 15, 2004 submittal to KHSAA show that \$280 more is spent on each male athlete than each female athlete. The benefits summary provided by the school for the re-visit does not match the numbers on the April 15, 2004 submittal. Re-visit interviews with school officials failed to verify that either document is correct (See KHSAA Recommended Action). The school's Athletic Director has developed a uniform rotation plan, but interviews with school officials, students, and the Gender Equity Review Committee indicated confusion as to whether or not booster clubs purchased uniforms for teams before their turn came up on the rotation schedule. The school re-visit also showed an inequity in the provision of athletic storage space for female teams (See KHSAA Recommended Action).</p>
<p>Scheduling of Games and Practice Time</p>	<p>X</p>		<p>Prime time scheduling was discussed. The original school visit showed a deficiency in this area primarily due to lack of prime time games for girls' basketball and poor school documentation. The school continued to fail to meet prime time requirements during the 2003-2004 basketball season (Refer to warning letter dated January 21, 2004, from KHSAA to the Principal of Lawrence County High School). A review of the school's 2004-2005 basketball schedules revealed that 46% of the girls' home basketball games are scheduled during prime time and 60% of the boys' home basketball games are to be in prime time. This meets the current standards as established by KHSAA and shows improvement by the school in this area. School officials were encouraged to continue to annually meet the standards in this regard.</p>

Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X		<p>The school re-visit and available documentation indicated some funding equivalence in the area of travel allotments. The audit report of March, 2003, requested that school officials develop some type of equitable meal allotment plan. During the school re-visit <u>no indication of administrative follow up in this matter could be found.</u></p>
Coaching	X		<p>Coaching salaries on the salary schedule provided appear equitable. Current documentation indicates that 43% of the girls' head coaches are employed off-campus compared with 25% of the boys' head coaches. School officials were encouraged to promote increased equivalence in this area.</p>
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities		X	<p>This area continues to be deficient because projects at the school have continued the disparity between benefits provided the baseball program and those going to the softball program. The school has installed lights and provided the required fence maintenance at the softball field. They are also providing a dressing area for girls' softball. A facility has been constructed adjacent to the baseball field which houses an office, a very nice baseball dressing area, and a batting cage. School officials appeared <u>not</u> to have assigned a dressing area for every team as requested by the audit report of March, 2003. Neither the softball nor volleyball teams appeared to have a designated area to store supplies or a designated office space. KHSAA officials were told that all other sports were provided these benefits. There appears to be a continued need to correct the drainage problem on the softball infield (See KHSAA Recommended Action). Although not an equity issue at this time, the school's track is in dire need of upgrading.</p>

Medical and Training Facilities and Services		X	The school has added a new weight room since the original school visit. There appears to be plenty of weight training equipment for all the school's athletes. Discussions with school officials indicated there is confusion about who schedules the weight room and which athletes may use it. The March, 2003 audit report requested that the school have a posted weight training schedule to be followed by all the teams at the school. The school re-visit did not reveal any evidence that this request has been implemented (See KHSAA Recommended Action).
Publicity	X		This area was designated as deficient in the March, 2003 report due to the school's failure to provide accurate information to KHSAA, and the apparent inequity in the selection process and the support provided by the school's cheerleaders. The school has provided documentation that the selection process has changed and provision for equitable assignment of cheerleaders is being implemented. Interviews with school personnel and comments made during the public meeting indicate there are still significant problems with cheerleading at the school. However, these problems appear to be related more to communication and administration than gender equity.
Support Services		X	Again, the original visit indicated concern in this area of administrative oversight of booster clubs and the accuracy of school documentation in this area. The re-visit indicated that booster control is still a concern and possible source of inequity (See KHSAA Recommended Action).

5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (Form T-60)

The school's most recent Corrective Action Plan calls for installation of lights at the softball field, provision of equitable support by the cheerleading squad, and pursuit of the indicated interest in girls' soccer.

6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

The currently designated deficiencies at Lawrence County High School are related to the provision of inequitable benefits in the areas of equipment and supplies; locker rooms, practice and competitive facilities; medical and training facilities and services; and support services (See KHSAA Recommended Action).

7. KHSAA Recommended Action in relation to new deficiencies: (Equipment and Supplies)

On or before **February 1, 2005**, school personnel shall submit to the KHSAA a new **Form T-71** (refer to KHSAA re-visit document). The equipment and supplies column (#5) should be filled out with correct figures for the 2003-2004 school year. This column should reflect actual expenditures from any and all sources.

On or before **February 1, 2005**, school personnel shall submit a letter to the KHSAA describing the actual policy for uniform purchases at the school. This letter is to include purchases by each source (i.e. school and/or booster clubs).

On or before **February 1, 2005**, school personnel are to submit a letter to the KHSAA describing the steps being taken to provide a storage area for athletic supplies for the softball and volleyball teams.

(Medical and Training Services)

On or before **February 1, 2005**, school personnel are to submit a letter to the KHSAA showing the usage plan for the new school weight room and batting facility. This letter is to be signed by the school's Athletic Director, Principal, and District Superintendent.

(Support Services)

On or before **February 1, 2005**, school personnel are to submit a written plan (agreement) outlining the school's administrative procedures and supervision regarding booster club spending. The plan should include, but not be limited to, how and when purchases are approved, a system for ensuring equity in purchasing supplies and equipment, and the designated line of communication with booster organizations. This letter is to be signed by both the school Principal and Athletic Director.

**8. KHSAA Recommended Action in relation to re-occurring deficiencies:
(Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities)**

On or before **February 1, 2005**, school personnel are to submit to the KHSAA a letter giving detailed information relating to the steps being taken to upgrade the provision of benefits to the softball program. The letter should include, but not be limited to, the following:

- The completion data for the provision of new dugouts at the softball field (floors are already poured). The date of completion should be no later than **April 1, 2005.**
- The school plan for provision of a press box/storage area for softball supplies. The completion date for this should be no later than **December 30, 2005.** This letter is to be signed by the school Principal, Athletic Director, and District Superintendent.

On or before **February 1, 2005**, school personnel are to submit a letter to the KHSAA detailing how provision of office space and/or storage space will be provided to the volleyball program.

On or before **February 1, 2005**, school personnel are to submit a letter to the KHSAA listing the assigned dressing area for every sport currently offered at Lawrence County High School.

10. Comments:

It is further recommended by the KHSAA Audit Team that school officials go through the original March 10, 2003, audit report and make sure that all forms that were required to be corrected are corrected and placed properly in the Title IX file. Care should also be taken to remove any incorrect forms.

It is also recommended that an official of KHSAA visit Lawrence County High School between April 1 and April 15, 2005 to assess progress and/or completion in the following areas:

- **Title IX file** (i.e. Gender Equity Committee meeting minutes, facility usage schedules, dressing room assignments, policies and procedures for booster clubs, posting of athletic recognition, proper opportunities calculations, expenditure records, etc.)
- **Softball field** (progress made in the required upgrading)
- **Athletic facilities** (equity in sharing)
- **Office and storage space** (equitable provision)



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I. LCHS Department of Athletics Philosophy

Athletics are a vital part of the overall education of many of our students. While it is true athletics play an important role, we must maintain high standards for the educational considerations of our student-athletes. Participating in interscholastic athletic competition is secondary to the students' educational experience.

Athletics play a major role in joining the school and the community. Civic pride identified with our athletic programs can be a tremendous asset to our school. Successful athletic teams will undoubtedly foster this pride, but successful students will continue to contribute to their community for a lifetime.

In order to build successful athletes and students coaches must work together and encourage participation in any program a student shows interest or aptitude. Students have a limited amount of time in high school and must be allowed to pursue as many interests as possible.

Coaches should provide opportunities for their athletes to

- 1. Grow physically, mentally, emotionally and socially.**
- 2. Develop concepts of loyalty, cooperation, fair play, dedication and self-discipline.**
- 3. Develop special skills for each sport.**
- 4. Develop self-motivation both on and off the field.**
- 5. Develop the ability to make the best choices with their time and energy.**

IV. Coaches' Responsibilities

The responsibilities discussed below will fall primarily on the head coach of each sport. All assistant and volunteer coaches should accept these responsibilities in the absence of the head coach.

- 1. All head coaches must attend the KHSAA required rules clinic and medical symposiums.**
- 2. All coaches will complete the required CPR – First Aid training and provide proper documentation.**
- 3. Coaches will ensure that all athletes are using proper technique and equipment and will also ensure direct adult supervision during all practices, scrimmages and games.**
- 4. All coaches will complete a coach's information sheet and have all athletes complete an athlete's information sheet.**
- 5. Coaches are not to allow athletes to play, practice or scrimmage without the proper KHSAA physical and parental permission form on file.**
- 6. Coaches will follow all KHSAA and Lawrence County High School rules concerning practice, eligibility, transportation, age requirements etc.**
- 7. Coaches will maintain open lines of communication with the administration, parents and community.**

V. Booster Clubs

All coaches will ensure that any booster club that is providing benefit of any type to their team or athletes will follow all guidelines in the booster club agreement. The agreement will include but not be limited to the following:

By July 31 of each year

- 2. The booster club will provide a year-end financial statement outlining all monies spent during the previous fiscal year.**
- 3. The booster club will provide a tentative budget for the current fiscal year.**
- 4. The booster club will not use the name or address of Lawrence County High School or the Lawrence County Board of Education.**

VI. Purchasing

Before any purchase can be made using school funds the coach will complete a purchase order and submit to the athletic director for approval. After the purchase order has the signature of the principal and athletic director and has been issued the proper PO number and only after all three of these criteria have been met may an order be placed.

All shipments must come through the athletic director in order for the school to pay the invoice. Do not ship in the name of the head coach, team or booster club. Do not pick-up the order yourself. Purchase order codes and numbers will be put on PO's by the administration. Coaches are not to sign any portion of the PO. Please plan ahead and follow the yearly budget when submitting requests.

At the end of this handbook are PO's, a current budget, and a uniform rotation plan.

VII. Scheduling

Coaches will be responsible for creating a tentative schedule of games, meets and or matches each year. They should submit these schedules to the athletic director as soon as possible for approval and so that they can be entered on the KHSAA website. Schedules of practice times and facilities will also be given to the athletic director for approval and to resolve any conflict of facility use.

Any change of schedule will have to be coordinated through the coach and the AD. It will not always be possible to arrange gate workers and officials without proper notice. When inclement weather makes it necessary to cancel games, the principal and the AD will make the final decision. Coaches will be given every opportunity possible for their input as whether to cancel a contest or not.

The director of transportation must be notified in advance of departure times and cancellations. Transportation can be arranged by individual coaches or by the AD. Communication between them will be vital to assure busses are there when needed.

VIII. Travel

All athletes must be transported to away events via district provided transportation. Only with prior approval by the superintendent and principal can this be changed. Students may be released to return home to their parent using the transportation "RELEASE from LIABILITY" form. Keep all documentation on file throughout the season.

Release from Liability

I, the undersigned parent/guardian, am assuming the responsibility of providing my child transportation home after the school event. I agree to release LCHS or any persons representing Lawrence County High School from liability for any injuries my child may incur during the return home.

IX. Wellness Center

The athletic director will schedule the Wellness Center for use by LCHS varsity sports. All teams requesting use of the building will be given access. A schedule will be posted in the building and coaches may make arrangements with each other for use of the building during another teams allotted time. There will also be a schedule for the community to be able to use the building. No athlete is to be in the building unless under the direct supervision of district personnel.

X. Inventories

At the end of each season the coach shall provide an inventory of all uniforms, equipment and supplies belonging to the school. This should include any purchases made by booster clubs and provided to the coach or team. This inventory will be submitted to the athletic director within thirty (30) days of the team's final contest.

XI. Student Athlete

The coaches will assure that their athletes adhere to both the KHSAA and Lawrence County High School's policy concerning academic eligibility. For students to participate the following criteria must be met

- At the beginning of their first year in high school they must have completed the eighth grade.
- At the beginning of their second year they must have earned at least 5.25 credits.
- At the beginning of their third year they must have earned at least 12.25 credits.
- At the beginning of their fourth year they must have earned at least 19.0 credits.
- Once they have entered high school they will only be eligible for four consecutive years.
- Students' grades will be checked on a weekly basis. A student failing more than one block of classes will not be allowed to participate in practice or competition at any level for the following week. A block will consist of either on 90-minute class or two short classes.
- Students are required to have an annual physical examination, a complete a parental consent form and a complete student information sheet.
- Athletes are not allowed to condition, practice or play without a physical on file.
- A student information sheet and a form to give consent and a physical examination form follow.

These awards will be at the discretion of the coach.





the coaches and athletes in the Wellness Center. New schedules are created as our sports seasons change.


In section 8 paragraph 3 the report asks for locker rooms to be assigned to all varsity sports. This assignment is also included in this letter.
