This same error was discussed during the KHSAA's school visit. However, the error continues. Instead, the school should determine compliance based on student surveys under prong three of the compliance test.

Information provided regarding girls' golf (equipment and supplies) is misleading if the school did not have a team due to lack of interest. If that is the case, equipment and supplies for this team should not be evaluated.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		The summary chart regarding football is incomplete (T-14); corrected information should be provided by school.
Travel and Per Diem Allowances		?	Softball receives a meal expense while baseball does not; Booster Club for girls' basketball team provides benefits that are provided by school for boys' basketball team; T-16 is not provided for boys' basketball (while some teams have not provided information on summary pages, the information is included on the team charts T-15).
Coaching	X		Salary schedules are equal for comparable sports.
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	x		Information regarding locker rooms used by a number of teams is missing; forms T-26 & T-27 need to be submitted.
Medical and Training Facilities and Services	x		Inconsistent answer given regarding who pays for medical exams for softball players (both "yes" and "no" are checked). Same answer given regarding use of the weight room by boys" track; it appears that girls' basketball receives more benefits than the boys' team.

On or before **December 15, 2000**, the school shall identify sports that are responsive to student surveys (more information is needed regarding "other" category in order to evaluate compliance).

On or before December 15, 2000, the school shall date the GE-19 previously submitted.

On or before **December 15, 2000**, the school shall correct the Summary Chart for equipment and supplies to include information regarding practice uniforms for girls' softball, boys' basketball and football. (T-8).

On or before **December 15, 2000**, the school shall confirm the dates and starting times for girls' basketball for the upcoming year. (Have prime time games been scheduled?)

On or before **December 15, 2000**, the school shall confirm whether the same quality cheerleaders ("A" team vs. "B" team) are provided to girls' and boys' basketball teams. The school shall explain how cheerleaders are chosen. In addition, the school should provide additional information regarding pep bands and related groups performing at girls' and boys' events.

Information regarding locker rooms and facilities was not provided for a number of teams. This information shall be provided to the KHSAA on or before **December 15, 2000**.

On or before **December 15, 2000**, the school shall submit corrected information regarding scheduling of games for football teams. (Form T-14). Previous submission is incomplete.
