Beginning with the 2002-2003 school year, it is suggested that students in eighth grade participate in order to gather information relative to future interests in athletic activities.

Equipment and Supplies	X		The quality and quantity of uniforms are comparable for both male and female teams. It is suggested that the Gender Equity Review Committee develop a written policy for the purpose of purchasing and replacing uniforms.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		The girls' basketball schedule for the 2002-2003 season includes six prime time games. Additionally, four doubleheaders are planned; two of which are scheduled during prime time. An early/late rotation is in effect for the basketball team's use of the gymnasium floor.
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X		It appears that coaches may have varying attitudes toward the purchase of meals for student athletes. The Gender Equity Review Committee should develop a policy to cover this expense in an equitable manner.
Coaching	X		An explanation of pay scales for the various coaching positions is kept in the Title IX File. Pay is comparable for both male and female sports. School personnel are encouraged to develop strategies to insure that adult females actively seek

		coaching slots as they become open.
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X	The Lynn Camp Middle and High School campus was recently constructed. 2002-2003 marks the fourth year for students. Overall, the locker rooms and competitive facilities are in excellent conditions. An, eight-lane track surrounds the football field. Practices are held at home and meets are scheduled away. Two tennis courts have been completed within the last year and are shared by both the boys and girls teams. The gymnasium floor was refinished this fall and includes ports for volleyball standards. This is the first year of a full schedule for varsity and junior varsity volleyball. It is recommended that the Gender Equity Review Committee write a policy governing the display of honors and awards for display in the gymnasium and trophy cases. Accommodations for dressing, a total of four locker rooms, are comparable and equitably shared. The baseball complex on campus is well appointed. The softball team uses a field maintained by the city of Corbin and is located approximately nine miles from campus. The facility is satisfactory. However, a plan for an oncampus softball facility should be developed. During the audit team's visit, school personnel indicated that a feasibility study is underway to address this issue. Until such time that softball games are held on campus, it is suggested that an activity bus be provided for transporting the players.
Medical and Training Facilities and Services	X	The services of a trainer are provided through a contract with Kentucky Physical Therapy. There is an agreed upon schedule among the coaches for use of the weight room. This schedule should be publicly posted.
Publicity	X	Seasonal schedules, both in poster and individual card format, are printed. There is one cheerleading squad that performs at both boys and girls basketball games.

It appears that the Gender Equity Review Committee at Lynn Camp High School is working diligently to provide equal opportunities and benefits for all students. However, the work of the committee would be enhanced with the addition of a student representative.

Overall, the interscholastic athletics program clearly has the support of the school community. At this time, the most pressing need is to secure funding so that an oncampus softball facility is made available for the softball team. The audit team also encourages the Gender Equity Review Committee to design a number of polices, as put forth in this report, to strengthen the governing of the athletic program. Most importantly, the committee should give consideration to developing policies and procedures for the oversight of expenditures by the booster groups.
