Accommodation of Interests and Abilities	X		According to the data and responses provided by the school, it has met the standards established in all three tests for opportunities in both the 2000-2001 and 2001-2002 school years. The school appeared to be making a sincere effort to increase opportunities for participation for female students. The proper development of and follow up to a corrective action plan was discussed with school officials. The school has Gender Equity Review Committee meeting minutes for all meetings held during the past two years. The school has student representation on the Gender Equity Review Committee.
Equipment and Supplies	X		The school visit showed a very high quality of uniforms provided for all athletes at the school. It is suggested that the school develop a written uniform replacement schedule. School officials were alerted to the fact that all team sheets (T5's) in the area of equipment and supplies should show an inventory of uniforms and not the number per player. This data should be corrected in the school's Title IX file.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time		X	All shared athletic facilities at the school appeared to be shared equitably. "Prime time" scheduling for girls' basketball was discussed. According to the school" 2002-2003 girls' basketball schedule, 24% of their total games were played in "prime time" but only 12.5% of home games were played in "prime time". This low percentage is the reason the school is currently considered deficient in this area. (See KHSAA Recommended Action.)
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X		The meal allotment shown on the summary form in this area is inconsistent with the allotments shown on the team forms. School officials were told that this should be corrected in the Title IX file.

Coaching	X	It appeared from the school visit that the school attempts to hire qualified coaches for all athletic teams. The district extra service pay schedule appears to be equitable. On the school's summary sheets in this area, there is no indication of whether the coach is employed on or off campus. This data is to be corrected in
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X	the Title IX file. There appeared to be basic parity in the structure and use of all competitive facilities. School officials were alerted to the fact that a T-27 form for every practice and/or competitive facility should be in the Title IX file. These forms should be completed and placed in the school file no later than May 30, 2003.
Medical and Training Facilities and Services	Х	The school provided no training room or certified trainer for any athlete at the school. School officials are requested to have a posted weight training schedule for the school weight room.
Publicity	X	Cheerleading was discussed. The school currently has one cheer squad which cheers at all home boys and girls' basketball games and all post season tournament games for both teams.
Support Services	X	Booster clubs and their management were discussed. The school currently has two booster clubs —one for football and one for girls' basketball. Forms T-35 and T-36 submitted by the school in 2002-2003 appear to show basic parity in spending.

5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (T-60)

The school's most recent Corrective Action Plan calls for scheduling an overnight tournament trip for girls' basketball and insuring parity of support by cheerleaders for boys' and girls' basketball.

6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

The major observed deficiency during the school visit was the lack of prime time girls' basketball games.

7. Facility Recommendations or Concerns

Although not an equity issue at this time, the lack of dressing room and locker space for all athletes was a major concern. Also, there appeared to be a distinct lack of adequate storage space for athletic equipment.

This list is to include the day of the week, time of games, and the opponent played for each prime time game. The school is also to document how these newly scheduled games will increase the school's prime time percentage for home games to at least 45%.
