Based on the information provided in the 2002-2003 Annual Report, it appears that Substantial Proportionality is an area of compliance. Of the 47 students attending Piarist School, 31 were female or 66% of the total enrollment. Of the 29 student athletes, 22, or 76% were females. The percentage of total participation 76%, compared to the percentage of total enrollment 66%, is above the three percent for likely compliance with the standard for Test 1.

However, a boys' basketball team is again included in the athletic program for the 2003-2004 season. Athletic offerings for boys and girls are varsity teams for cross country, golf and basketball. The Gender Equity Review Committee is encouraged to consider adding a spring sport for students attending the Piarist School.

For the 2003- 2004 basketball season, the girls will play two of their nine games during "prime time." This represents 22% of their home contests. Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X		A school van is used for transportation to practices and away athletic events. Athletes pay for their own meals during away events.
Coaching	X		The Athletic Director coaches all sports and receives a stipend for the position of athletic director but does not receive pay for coaching responsibilities.
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X		The Piarist School does not have a gymnasium but is adjacent to the Mountain Christian Academy and leases their gymnasium for home basketball games. Basketball practices are held at the Martin Community Center at no charge. The golf team plays on a nine-hole course located at Jenny Wiley State Park. The cross country teams practice and host meets on the trails of Jenny Wiley State Park.

#### 10. Comments

The Gender Equity Review Committee is representative and includes parents and a student, as well as school personnel. The permanent Title IX file was made available during the KHSAA Audit Team's visit. Community members elected not to attend the public forum scheduled for 6:00 pm.

The student enrollment, approximately fifty students, is drawn from five counties surrounding Martin, Kentucky. Students admitted to the Piarist School must achieve seventy percent on a standardized high school placement exam and all graduates attend post secondary schools. The athletic program is limited due to the small enrollment and, clearly, the primary mission of the school is to prepare young people for college. However, both opportunities and benefits are comparable for male and female athletes. Athletic teams are offered during the fall and winter seasons and the program would be strengthened with the addition of a spring sport.
