			permanent bleachers, whereas the softball field has bleachers brought in from the football field during the season. Dirt has been added to the softball field to help with drainage. The softball field has a	
			portable fence used during the playing season. Although both fields are basically equitable, the baseball field is nicer in appearance and includes a brick wall and is better manicured. It is suggested that work on the softball field	
			continue in order to make the softball field as attractive as the baseball field.	

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Medical and Training Facilities and Services	X	School personnel are to be commended for providing a trainer to serve the athletes. The school currently has a weight room that has the environment conducive to the male athlete. There is a very limited amount of weight equipment that can be used by female athletes. A posted schedule showed infrequent use by female athletes.
Publicity	X	Cheerleading was discussed. There are three cheerleading squads. All squads cheer equally for both boys' and girls' teams.
Support Services	x	The school currently has no active athletic booster clubs. Although this is not a gender equity issue, the Athletic Director is a part- time position. For a school the size of Simon Kenton, it might enhance the Title IX oversight of athletic programs for both boys and girls if this were a full-time position.

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### 7. Facility Recommendations or Concerns

The KHSAA Audit Team recommends that school personnel look for ways to enhance the environment of the weight room and to provide more equipment that can be used by female athletes. Also, school personnel need to make sure that the press box is finished for the softball field for the upcoming season. Permanent bleachers should be installed, and the overall appearance of the softball field should be comparable to the baseball field.

(Selection of Cheerleaders) On or before April 15, 2004, school personnel are requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys' and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sport (i.e., boys' varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).

(Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball) On or before April 15, 2004, school personnel are requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2004-2005 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during "prime times" (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for "prime times"), the school shall advise the KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference.
