Equipment and Supplies		X	Due to inaccurate data submitted, total analysis was not possible. Review of uniforms provided was satisfactory with the exception of the quality of softball uniforms. The athletic director was advised of the auditors' evaluation, and a recommendation was made to upgrade. Inconsistencies between Forms T-5 and Forms T-6, T-7, and T-8 were reviewed.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		No inequities were observed. Inconsistencies between Form T-11 and Forms T-12, T-13, and T-14 were reviewed.

Coaching	X		Disparity in the number of off-campus coaches for boys' and girls' sports was noted in the original self-evaluation. Some progress has been made in that regard. Coaching stipends have been made more equitable as well.
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities		X	More girls' teams share locker room facilities than do boys' teams. However, new facilities are under construction to relieve the situation. Recent upgrading of outdoor competitive and practice facilities has been more beneficial to boys' sports. Upgrading of softball dugouts, backstop, and safety topping for fencing are recommended before further future enhancements of boys' facilities or coed facilities are undertaken. In the new field house under construction, a dedicated locker room for a girls' team should be given priority if one is assigned for a boys' team. Storage space as near practice and competitive facilities as possible should be assigned all teams. More girls' teams and coed teams than boys' teams lack this benefit.
Medical and Training Facilities and Services		X	Strength-training equipment for girls' teams was not equivalent to that available for male athletes. School personnel appeared to have provided very good medical services to all athletes.
Publicity	X		The school has one cheerleading squad that cheers for football games and for both basketball varsity teams. School personnel were advised to expand promotion activities for girls' sports other than basketball.

Support Services		X	School personnel were not able to verify budget data on Forms T-35 and T-36 due to past personnel changes and loss of some records. Booster groups seemed to be willing to cooperate with school personnel in sharing oversight of expenditures, though no clear formal policy was in place. Office space for off-campus coaches was lacking, which affected access for female athletes more than for male athletes.

Policy should be generated to supply administrative support and oversight in this area.

5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (T-60)

School personnel have concentrated on construction and upgrading of facilities, particularly locker rooms. The addition of volleyball has been completed, and the scheduling of more girls' basketball games in "prime time" has been completed, i.e. for the 2003-2004 school year fifty percent of home games will be played in "prime time".

6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

The permanent Title IX file at the school was found to have inconsistent or omitted data. Policies appeared to be informal rather than formal. For these reasons, ongoing evaluation of programs by school personnel will be hampered.

7. Facility Recommendations or Concerns

The softball field needs to be upgraded as mentioned above. A dedicated locker room for a girls' team in the new field house should be designated if one is for a boys' team. Designating storage areas and finding a means of allowing access to coaches for golf, track, volleyball, and softball athletes should be implemented because they affect proportionately more female athletes than male athletes.

(Publicity) On or before April 15, 2004, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys' and

boys' and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sport (i.e., boys' varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).

(Scheduling of Games and Practice Time) On or before April 15, 2004, school personnel are requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2004-2005 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during "prime times" (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for "prime times"), the school shall advise the KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference.

(Equipment and Supplies) On or before December 15, 2003, school personnel will resubmit Forms T-6, T-7, T-8, T-9, and T-10, based on current inventory provided by current coaches on Form T-5.

(Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities) As an attachment to the 2003-2004 Title IX annual report, school personnel will submit an outline of locker room and equipment storage assignments planned for all teams in all facilities once new construction is completed. Proximity to practice and competitive facilities for each team should be noted.

(Support Services) On or before December 15, 2003, school personnel will re-submit Forms T-35 and T-36 (Budget Summary) for the 1999-2000 school year, using financial data available for that year. Attached should be a statement of policy generated for administrative oversight of fundraising activities and all expenditures for athletics. On the same date, school personnel will provide a plan to enhance the access of athletes to coaches both in season and out of season.

(Housing and Dining Facilities and Services) On or before December 15, 2003, school personnel will submit a statement of policy that is endorsed by the principal on the provision of pre- and post-game meals/snacks by the school or by booster groups.

(Corrective Action Plan—Form T-60) On or before December 15, 2003, school personnel will re-submit a Form T-60 for 1999-2000, 2000-2001, 2001-2002, and 2002-2003. Each should reflect what originally was submitted that year, along with the status of each item that was listed for correction the previous year. The 2002-2003 form should be revised to include plans for upgrading the softball field.

10. Comments

The school's permanent Title IX file was brought to the Gender Equity Review Committee meeting.

Corrections and data omissions on many forms were reviewed with the Gender Equity Review Committee, which was very interested and helpful in providing some missing information. Personnel turnover in coaches and administrators has been a deterrent in maintaining an accurate permanent Title IX file. It was stressed to school administrators and the Committee that the self-evaluation document of 1999-2000 serves as a baseline document by which to measure progress towards meeting compliance standards and as such should contain accurate data. A STATEMENT VERIFYING THAT ALL OMISSIONS AND CORRECTIONS HAVE BEEN RECONCILED AND PLACED IN THE SCHOOL'S PERMANENT TITLE IX FILE SHOULD BE SENT TO THE KHSAA OFFICE BY DECEMBER 15, 2003.

School personnel were advised to place written policies, charts, or schedules in its permanent Title IX file on:

- A. uniform purchase rotation
- B. use of practice and competitive facilities
- C. locker room assignments
- D. use of the strength training area
- E. scheduling competitions/administrative oversight
- F. an awards system for athletic achievement
- G. criteria for displays recognizing athletic achievement, teams and individuals
- H. selection and assignment of cheerleaders
- I. Provision of promotional materials, i.e. schedules cards, posters, etc.

The community meeting did not materialize.

The attached documents are in response to the Title IX audit conducted this fall. This audit has been an eye opening experience for our gender equity committee. The following notes are to explain some of the findings of this audit response.

- T5 The T5 surveys are a reflection of uniforms and equipment that are distributed to student athletes. Items that are used collectively by a team are not included in this survey. The coaches were asked to inventory uniforms that they intended to issue this year. Out dated uniforms are not counted and will be removed from inventory. This survey reflected that softball is extremely lacking in uniforms. We are in the process of ordering new uniforms to correct this inequity. Some sports in which athletes compete at different levels will appear that the lower levels of the sport are under equipped. These sports generally issue the varsity equipment to all athletes and they are not reflected on the lower level T5.
- T35 & T36 The figures on these forms are what could be recovered from financial records. The financial report
 used does not indicate in the memo what each transaction was used for therefore accuracy is not perfect. A
 budget was not found for athletic expenditures for this year and the current administration was not in place for the
 1999-2000 school year. Our more recent reports indicate that the current administration has held a tighter grip on
 gender equity.

In closing, I feel that this audit has been good for Todd Central. All stakeholders have gained a greater understanding of the need for Title IX and the processes for compliance. If you have questions or concerns with our response please do not hesitate to contact me.
