Equipment and Supplies	X		Walton Verona has had two previous audits and both audits have revealed Satisfactory reports in the area of Equipment and Supplies. At the time of the 2013 Audit the Uniform Rotation Plan has been updated by the Gender Equity Committee and is now on a 4 year cycle. The uniforms are of excellent quality and quantity. It is pointed out that the school has made tremendous progress with spending in this area. Gender Equity minutes show that administrative oversight is very much present in this area.	
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	Х		This is an area that was Satisfactory in both of the previous audits. Schedules are in place for the sharing of facilities in like sports. There appears to be great cooperation with the coaches in like sports and throughout the Walton Verona Athletic Department. The scheduling opportunities for all sports, appears to be equal for male and female teams.	
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	Х		This was an area that was Satisfactory in each of the previous audits and remains as such. Walton Verona should continue to review and update its Travel and Per Diem policy each year.	
Coaching	X		Walton Verona has been Satisfactory in this area during the previous audits and they continue to provide quality coaching for their young people. Compensation of coaches appears to be equal when comparing like sports. Coach accessibility is good as all sports have at least one coach working on campus. All the coaches appear to be qualified to coach the sports they are responsible for with a yearly evaluation plan in place so that coaches are responsible for their	

		daily performance.
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X	This was another are where a Satisfactory report was given during the previous audits. Locker rooms have been assigned to all sports. The practice and competitive facilities have made tremendous improvements since the beginning of Title IX in 1999. Constant oversight must be in place to keep these facilities at a high level and safe for all the participating athletes.

Medical and Training Facilities and Services	X	A trainer is provided by Cincinnati Sports Medicine and they are on campus daily with a schedule and contact information posted on the training room door. The trainer is present at basically all the home athletic events. The two weight rooms have teams that use them in accordance with the location to their respective facilities. The Gender Equity committee needs to continue to monitor the scheduling and upkeep of these two training facilities by upgrading and/or replacing equipment on a yearly basis to assure safety.
Publicity	X	The various interviews with coaches and athletes gave a good indication that the school is in good shape in this area. The trophy cases are well organized and show that all sports are represented. Team banners are in place but individual recognition is something that needs some attention in the Awards and Banner Policy. The Gender Equity Committee needs to review the Awards and Banner Policy yearly to stay abreast of what other schools are doing and how they can best reflect and represent the Walton Verona High School and all their athletes' accomplishments.
Support Services	X	One cheerleading squad performs at all football games and all home boys and girls basketball games. The Gender Equity Committee is reminded that a never ending process of observing budgets needs to take place. The school is doing a very good job with Administrative Oversight of all the boys and girls team and making sure that everything is equal for all involved

5. <u>Brief Summary/Analysis of the Improvement Plan (Form T-60)</u> The Walton Verona School Board and Walton Verona High School did a tremendous job of looking at a long range plan and putting practice and competitive facilities in place for the student athletes involved. In talking with the Athletic Director some very interesting ideas are being talked about to improve the facilities even more. These ideas should be documented and presented to the Gender Review Committee.

- 6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs At the present time there were no deficiencies found in the girls and boys programs, but there were areas discussed with the Athletic Director that could be improved upon.

 There were no deficiencies at this time. Upgrades are constantly needed to keep facilities at a high level. The Gender Equity Committee needs to tour the facilities on a regular basis to help the Athletic Director develop improvement plans.
