It is also noted that the school appears to be compliant under part three of the compliance test, full and effective accommodation of interest and abilities.

Equipment and Supplies	X		Check marks were listed on the summary sheet instead of numbers. The school is requested to resubmit this sheet by February 15, 2001. Also, the volleyball and basketball team charts show a total of four managers, and the summary sheet shows a total of two managers. The athletic director stated that there were only two managers total. Care should be taken to make sure these forms are the same.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		There are discrepancies in the summary forms and team forms filled out by the coaches, which the athletic director explained satisfactorily.
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X		There is inconsistency in the amount of money provided for meals on the team forms. The athletic director has been asked to resubmit this information by February 15, 2001.
Coaching	X		Discrepancies in this area of the report were clarified by the athletic director.
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities		X	The girls' basketball locker room has small, metal lockers. The boys' basketball locker room has large wooden lockers that are more practical and useful. The softball field is not on the same level overall in comparison to the baseball field. The softball field is also used by the parks department, and the baseball field is not. It is recommended that the condition of the softball field, press box, dugouts, and bleachers be upgraded to the same standard as the baseball field.
Medical and Training Facilities and Services	X		Although this area is basically satisfactory, it is recommended that a schedule for use of the weight room be posted. Also, more weights that are appropriate for females need to be added.
Publicity	X		The school has shown progress in this area but needs to continue contacting the media to promote coverage of girls sports. The samples of game programs for boys' and girls' sports, as well as posters and schedule cards, are excellent in quality.

(Selection of Cheerleaders) On or before April 15, 2001, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys' and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sport (i.e., boys' varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).

(Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball) On or before April 15, 2001, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2000/2001 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during prime times (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for prime times), the school shall advise the KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference.

(Equipment and Supplies Summary Sheet) On or before February 15, 2001, the school will resubmit the equipment and supplies summary sheet using numbers instead of check marks.

(Travel and Per Diem Allowances) On or before February 15, 2001, the school will resubmit information concerning the amount of money spent for meals in all sports.
