Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	<b>X</b>		Some concerns were expressed by coaches regarding practice time and scheduling of games. The school played 50% of their girls' games in "prime time". The school does have a rotating schedule regarding practice time.

Coaching	X		There were some discrepancies reported in years of experience which school personnel need to check and correct. No salary was listed for the volleyball coach. The discrepancies between Forms T-35 & T-36 regarding coaching salaries need to be corrected. Forms T-18 & T-25 need to be corrected as well. The school has established a salary schedule since this report. It was suggested that school personnel establish a point of contact for these students who have coaches that are off-campus.

Improvements in facilities are being made in soccer and softball, and an addition to the gym is in progress.

This school's report and subsequent calculations were difficult to analyze since so many students below grade 9 are used in above grade 9 participation. This incorporation of below grade 9 students is permissible, just unusual in the abundant use of such students. However, the student survey done annually to determine student interest should include students in grades 8, 9, 10 and 11 only. In that light, a new survey should be done and submitted no later than **September 15, 2003**, on appropriate KHSAA Form T-63, and should include interest of students in Grades 8 and above only. School personnel are encouraged to place the actual student survey instrument (Form T-61) in their permanent Title Ix file. Survey return should equal approximately 80%.

(Selection of Cheerleaders) On or before September 15, 2003, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys' and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sport (i.e., boys' varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).

(Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball) On or before September 15, 2003, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2003-2004 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during "prime times" (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for "prime times"), the school shall advise the KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference.
