KHSAA 1999-2000 ANNUAL REPORT (Commissioner's Report to Delegate Assembly)

Two hundred eighty-four schools joined the Association for the 1999-2000 school year. Six of these schools enroll girls only and six have only boys. Enrollment for 1998-1999 was 283 and for 1997-1998 was 283.

There were 216 schools involved in **Football**. The 8-man championship was played at Kentucky State on November 19th. Classes A, AA, AAA and AAAA championship games were played at the Kentucky Fairgrounds, Louisville, on December 3-4. The approximate gross receipts from Playoff Rounds One through Four were \$500,000 with expenses of conducting these games reported as \$200,000. Paid attendance at the 120 games was approximately 128,000. All profits from the playoff games prior to the finals are divided among the member schools.

The number of schools competing in **Volleyball** was 144. The KHSAA sanctioned state tournament was held at Ryle HS & Gray Middle School in Union, on October 29-30,1999.

In **Cross Country** 232 boys' teams entered 18 regional meets. Two hundred thirty-one girls' teams entered three classes in 18 regionals. Classes A, AA and AAA were held in Lexington at the Kentucky Horse Park on November 6, 1999.

There were 158 schools competing in **Boys' Soccer** and 130 schools participating in **Girls' Soccer**. The State Finals were held consecutively at Georgetown College in Georgetown, KY on November 6, 1999.

There were 253 teams competing in **Boys' Golf**, with the State Tournament being played at Gibson Bay Golf Course in Richmond, KY. Two hundred fifteen teams competed in **Girls' Golf** with their State Tournament being held at Arlington Country Club in Richmond, KY. Both state tournaments were held during the week of October 4-8, 1999. There is no admission charged at the State Golf Tournaments.

There are 66 schools competing in **Wrestling** in eight districts and four regions with the winner and runner-up in each weight class advancing to the state finals. The championship tournament will be held at the Farnham Dudgeon Civic Center in Frankfort on February 18-19, 2000.

In **Swimming** 126 boys' and girls' teams will compete for the championships. The meets will be held at The Lancaster Aquatic Center on the University of Kentucky campus on February 18-19,2000.

The number of teams participating in **Boys' Basketball** is 276. Advance ticket sales to the tournament to be held in Lexington at Rupp Arena on March 15-18,2000 total \$393,696 as of January 8th, compared to \$395,663 on the same date last year.

Two hundred seventy-five teams are participating in **Girls' Basketball**. Advance ticket sales to the girls' tournament to be held on March 22-25,2000, in Richmond at Eastern Kentucky University total \$55,830 as of January 8th, compared to \$57,876 at this same time last year.

Anticipated spring sports participation is as follows: 270 **Baseball** teams to compete in 64 districts and 16 regions; 238 schools have indicated they will play **Fast Pitch Softball** in 62 districts and 16 regions. Fourteen schools have signed up for **Slow Pitch Softball**. There will be 244 schools participating in boys' and girls' **Track** in eight regions in each classification--A,

AA, AAA.; 213 girls' and 216 boys' **Tennis** teams will play in 13 regions. The state Baseball championship will be held at Cliff Hagan Stadium, University of Kentucky, and the Fast Pitch Softball Tournament will be held at Skyview Park in Jeffersontown, Kentucky. The Slow Pitch Tournament will be held in Hebron. The State Tennis and State Track Meets will be held at the University of Kentucky.
