Coach's Comments

Your team's accomplishment of advancing to the State Tournament:
 Head Coach Jeff Stowers decided 6 years ago to go with young players with a mindset to introduce them to his way of playing basketball. Finally the dividends paid off. Day after day working on defense, offensive skills, and learning to trust the Stowers system of play, Simon Kenton finally has earned its first ever berth in the Sweet 16. After joining the 8th region 3 years ago, SK has been close, but always the cinderella team, watch their aspirations of a tournament appearance dashed in the regional, losing to Shelby Cty in OT the first year and the same Shelby Cty in the Semi's last year. This year SK beat a very potent Anderson Cty 48-44 in the 8th region final. Entry into the premier tournament at Christmas time prepared SK for the rough road to the Sweet 16, as in other years people would say SK has a great record, but who did they play? This year SK toughened up the schedule, losing more games but gaining very valuable experience.

Coach's Comments

What are keys (players/offensive/defensive) to your team's success in winning the tournament:
 Jr guard Chelsea Tolliver must get over the jitters of playing in the big game as she can score at will when determined, and Sr guard Lauren Conley must hit the open shot to loosen up Chelsea. Jr center Kayla Smith can be a threat from anywhere on the floor, and at the very same time control the defensive board. Sr forward Sam Wormald can control the boards if she can stay out of foul trouble. Sam can score at will from close in on rebounds. The best defensive player, Sr Jesssica Farris, will obviously guard the best offensive opposing player, but don't doubt her offensive prowess. If she is hot, look for a big game from her. Off the bench, 9th grader Sydni Wainscott has ice in her blood, as she has personally pulled several game saves by hitting from the free-throw line when the game was on the line. Jr Caitlyn Figgins figures to get her points in the paint and to pressure the opposing team on defense. So guard Ali Ponzer can zero in on the basket from long range and handles the ball at point if necessary.
