This reminder that the KHSAA Delegate Annual Meeting is Wed., Jan. 13, at the Radisson Hotel in Lexington. Room reservations must be made by Dec. 28, in order to get the rooms at the discounted rate of \$89 (Single/Double) or \$99 (Triple/Quad). Delegates should note that the Radisson has reminded us that the night before (Jan. 12) is a University of Kentucky men's basketball game night and there will be NO grace period for late reservations at the above rate and rooms will then be subject to availability. Included in this mailing is a current listing of the delegates as submitted by each member school. If your delegate's name is missing or incorrect, you should contact the KHSAA IMMEDIATELY. Only registered delegates will be allowed to vote on proposals.

BASKETBALL TEAM PHOTOS DUE FEB. 1

Beginning this school year, each school is responsible for forwarding to the KHSAA office a team photograph of their boys' and girls' basketball teams with a legible photo identification (front row, LtoR) regardless if you feel a particular team's chances of making the state tournament are slim or you are superstitious. The photo must be an original photo as faxed copies, Xerox copies of photos, newspaper copies and laser printer copies are not acceptable.

Schools may want to make sure that additional prints of the photo are available for district and regional managers for use in those programs. Due to the timeliness of producing the state program on the heel of regionals, the KHSAA can not "wait" until a particular round is finished prior to receiving its copy of the photograph.

The deadline for submitting your boys' and girls' basketball team photos is Feb. 1, 1999. Failure to submit the photos WILL result in a fine assessed to the school.

This policy was adopted to aid our office in receiving and compiling the information prior to any district or regional tournament beginning.

BASKETBALL POSTSEASON SITES

The KHSAA staff published in the October/November issue of *the Athlete*, the listing of site selection plans in basketball regions according to what had been submitted by previous regional managers. Please remember that these (region) site selections constitute only a request, and the Commissioner will make the final decision.

REPORTING SCORES OF GAMES

Schools are reminded to submit the scores all basketball games immediately upon their conclusion (home or away/win or lose) to the KHSAA/Riherd's Scoreboard. The scores are then updated on the Internet. Many news organizations are reporting that this is the only way they are getting scores so it is very important that they report. REMINDER BYLAW 28 - STUDENT INSURANCE

Bylaw 28. Physician's Certificate and Parent's Consent

The Superintendent or Principal shall have each student who is trying for a place as a participant on an athletic team or cheerleading squad present a physician's certificate to the effect that he/she is physically fit to participate without undue risk. While the exam and its components may be performed by a variety of health care providers, the form must be signed by a medical doctor or doctor of osteopathy. The parent's consent for the child's participation and acknowledgment of receipt of the eligibility rules as promulgated by the Association and Kentucky Board of Education regulations in writing shall also be required.

Any student, prior to participation or trying for a place on an athletic team or cheerleading squad shall have in place medical insurance with coverage limits up to the deductible of the KHSAA Catastrophic Insurance program and such insurance shall remain in force throughout participation. It is the responsibility of each member school to ensure and certify that each student has insurance coverage throughout the school year.

TITLE IX SEMINARS

The KHSAA, in conjunction with the Kentucky School Board Association and the Kentucky Department of Education, recently conducted workshops in Bowling Green and Lexington regarding Title IX compliance guidelines for interscholastic athletics.

State regulations now mandate that KHSAA member schools be in compliance with Title IX as a condition of membership. Copies of Title IX guidelines and other resource materials will be available to member schools in January.

LOSS OF SCHOOL TIME FOR CONTESTS

A reminder of Bylaw 25, Limitation of Seasons - Sec. 1. Loss of School Time. No school time may be lost for travel to or from, or participation in, any regular season interscholastic athletic contest.

Q/A - What is the Associations' enforcement position on missed school time? At the request of the Kentucky Board of Education, the KHSAA annually solicits certification from school administrators that these provisions have not been violated.

OPEN MEETINGS REMINDER

This reminder to all district and regional tournament managers and others conducting KHSAA-related meetings. The Kentucky Attorney General has ruled that any and all meetings conducted by the KHSAA fall under the "Open Meetings" act. District, regional and state tournament draws should be conducted with an "open meeting" format. Also, always inform your local media with meeting information and send a copy of your bracket and if applicable, seeding information to the KHSAA.

STATE FAST PITCH SOFTBALL DATE CHANGE

Please note that the date for the 1999 KHSAA State Fast Pitch Softball Tournament at Panther Creek in Owensboro has changed. The 1999 event will now be played June 11-12. The event date is listed as June 10-11 on KHSAA Calendars and was changed after recent additional consultation with the host site.

DISQUALIFICATION REMINDER

Schools are reminded that contained in this year's form packet mailed in May was a new KHSAA Form GE9 to request the reinstatement of a disqualified player. It is no longer necessary to call the office to request the reinstatement if this form is properly completed unless it is a repeat or multiple game offender, or the official indicates additional investigation is necessary. Complete instructions are contained on the form.

MOLTEN LEATHER BASKETBALL TO BE USED

Some sporting goods vendors have called to say that Molten is now making a composite cover basketball with the same identifiers (B7L-W for boys and B6L-W for girls) as the leather cover ball they have provided in the past. A telephone call to Molten has reassured us that the leather ball is still available. The leather ball is the one that will be used in KHSAA postseason play.

SPRING SPORTS POSTSEASON

Several calls have been made to the office regarding Spring Sports Championships, most notably the Baseball/Fast Pitch Softball district tournaments.

As is listed on the 1998-99 KHSAA school calendars and in the new Handbooks, district baseball and fast pitch softball tournaments are scheduled to begin May 24. This is a week later than in the past. The change was made in March due to the Memorial Day holiday and facility availability at state venues.

The State Tennis Championships will be held June 3-5 and the State Track & Field Meet will be June 4-5. The State Fast Pitch Softball Tournament will be June 11-12 and the State Baseball Finals will be June 17-18.

TRANSPORTING TEAMS CLARIFICATION

Legislation passed during the 1998 session has now taken effect which has an impact on coaches in Kentucky. Please note the following changes in interpretations to KHSAA rules which will be published this year.

Q/A -1 Is the restriction on transportation of a student by the principal, coach or faculty a KHSAA regulation or state law? This bylaw is patterned and adopted after KRS 161.185 which states "Boards of education shall require a principal, coach, member of the faculty or a member of the administrative staff to accompany students on all school-sponsored or school-endorsed trips." Effective July 15, 1998, the legislature changed the provisions to give those individuals employed as Level II or III coaches the same authority as their faculty counterparts if approved by the local Board of Education.

Q/A 2 - Can a nonteaching paraprofessional accompany a team and/or drive the bus or van? Yes, that person can serve as the person to accompany the team in accordance with KRS 161.185 as amended by the Legislature effective July 15, 1998. It should be noted that this in no way removed or revised the requirements for the driver of the bus / van as that individual must continue to meet other state requirements.

COACHING QUALIFICATIONS CLARIFICATION

Another important change has occurred as it relates to coaching. The same bill (HB215) that passed concerning paraprofessional transportation also impacts coaching qualifications. In addition to the present KHSAA requirements, it is also necessary that a coach (head or assistant), at any level (grades 9-12) meet the following -

(1) Shall be 21 years of age, shall not be a violent offender or convicted of a sex crime as defined by KRS 17.165 which is classified as a felony, and shall submit to a criminal record check under KRS 160.380.

(2) A person holding a provisional or standard teaching certificate or having completed sixty-four semester hours of college credit from an accredited college or university as documented by an official transcript.

(3) Level 2 and 3 coaches shall have completed all requirements for the Kentucky Coaches Education Program as detailed in Section 1(d) of this bylaw prior to being hired and prior to beginning coaching duties.

(4) Prior to assuming duties, Level 2 and 3 coaches shall successfully complete training provided by the local school district. The training shall include, but not be limited to, information on the physical and emotional development of students of the age with whom the Level II and/or III coach will be working, the district's and school's discipline policies, procedures for dealing with discipline problems, and safety and first aid training. Follow up training shall be provided annually.

USE OF KHSAA REGISTERED OFFICIALS

The use of KHSAA registered officials is required for all freshman, JV and varsity contests. Assigning Secretaries, when making assignments are required to assign registered officials. However, should you employ your own officials for freshman or JV (Varsity are required to be assigned by Assigning Secretaries) games, you must insure that these officials are registered. Do not depend on the uniform patch to assume officials are KHSAA registered as the officials are no longer required to wear a patch. Each registered official has a registration card that identifies whether or not they are properly registered. This is the verification you should rely on and not the uniform patch.
